














From the Editor


From one Corvair Enthusiasts to another I'm afraid it's time to say goodbye to my years of owning Corvairs.

I met Burt Neuner sometime in 1972, through—what else—Corvairs. He had a red 1965 500 coupe, and I had a 61 Lakewood and a 65 Monza 4 door. I was still living in the northwest corner of Chicago (Edison Park), so the distance to his folk's place in Mount Prospect wasn't huge. We would check out low priced Corvairs for sale, and upon finding a suitable candidate, buy it and fix it up for resale or part it out if it was too far gone. Burt also acquired his green Lakewood around this time.

We went to many club events and meetings and became good friends. In early May of '75, there was to be a CORSA mini convention in Birmingham Alabama. At that time I had a 63 Greenbrier and Burt's Lakewood was driving well, so we decided a road trip to that convention might be fun. Rather than hit the super slab, I thought we might do the smaller town scenic tour specifically to scope out Chevrolet dealers with the thought that maybe they'd want to get rid of all those old Corvair parts.

I believe we began the trip by heading east to Highway 41 in Indiana. This nice road parallels I-65 for quite a way and indeed we stopped in every town on that route that was big enough to have a Chevy dealer. If the dealer had a nice new building on the main highway, we'd just drive on by; but if it was an older, smaller building in the downtown area, we'd quickly introduce ourselves to the parts department manager and ask about any Corvair parts. I can't remember how many

dealers we stopped at, but it was a lot. There were a couple of memorable finds—one dealer with a tiny two car showroom directed us to the attic above the parts department where we unearth not one but two complete NOS gas heater kits. Surely there were other parts there too—I still have a bunch of NOS back up lamp kits on the shelf—but we'd just shovel whatever we could buy cheap into the Greenbrier and head to the next town. Another dealer had some parts but also a fair number of the Jam Handy Filmstrips for both service and sales. We made a good buy on the parts but the dealer didn't want to sell the filmstrips—I wasn't pleased with that despite the parts find—so we walked around the corner after we left to a local bar on the town square for a beer. The barkeep carded us low and behold—I wasn't 21 yet—not for another four months—so that plan evaporated. Burt was a year older than me, so he bought a six-pack on the way out of town, and we stopped at a roadside picnic table to contemplate the success and failures of the day with Mr. High Life.

Another dealer had us digging around their attic for quite a while, and when we came out, I had been left a memento of our visit- a parking ticket! So we added the \$5 fine to our list of 'expenses'.

We had gotten quite a few sets of floor mats and kept loading all those in the back of Burt's Lakewood, making the weight distribution something like 25/75. Somewhere on the way, a local Barney Fife pulled Burt over "to see if you boys been drinkin' cause that little car looks like it's swaying around". We hadn't been drinking (not yet anyway) but the tail heavy wagon was demonstrating its dislike of the load. We were given a warning, and we might have even added some more air to the rear tires the next day.

The Mini ended at the Talladega racetrack where we got to do a (slow) parade lap before the NASCAR event got under way. Boy, is that track *banked*! Go too far up and the lifters started to click!

Our trip back was by highway, we both had to get back to work. The whole journey was mechanically speaking, uneventful; I don't we recall we had any problems with either vehicle. We did sell a bunch of those parts at the convention—I should say **Burt** sold a bunch of those parts, as his talent as a salesman was just beginning—we made some money, and had a great time doing it.

Over the next 46 years, we'd drive along together to countless more conventions, shows, parties, and family events. The cars and destinations changed, but the friendship, laughter, generosity, and no BS attitude of Burt never wavered.


