

More on the Stiletto



THE STILLETTO

Here is a radical new concept in custom car design which combines the talents of show producer Bob Larivee, model manufacturer George Toteff, designer Gene Baker, and builder Ron Gerstner. Credit for the concept goes to imaginative Detroit industrial designer Gene Baker, who terms the lines of the car as "organic styling", a marriage of multiple reverse radiuses and compound the contract of the car as compound the care of the care of

The STILLETTO is owned by the Show Car Division of Promotions Inc. and was built for its President, Bob Larivee, to fulfill his need of a really top-flight feature car for touring the Interna-

ional Championship Auto Shows.

In an initial application to custom cars, development stages were purposely paralleled to techniques of the auto industry and co-ordinated through the facilities of Model Products Corp. A 1/10th scale clay buck was produced from Boker's original sketches. Then, a 1/10th scale cast was made and a fiberglass model pulled. Full size drawings of the car's exterior were laid out prior to actual work on the car, itself.

All decisions pertaining to construction of the body, chassis and interior components remained the responsibility of Ron Gerst ner, who had been chosen to build the STILLETTO in his Buffalo N. Y., shop. Utilizing Corvair rear suspension and cross member Ron fabricated frame rails of 3 1/2" x 2" rectangular tubing. Referring to full scale drawings, Ron formed a 20-gauge sheet meta body for the car over a lightweight tubular birdcage framework


To conserve both weight and space, a rear-mounted Corvai engine and trans were picked as the most practical and the 100' Corvair wheelbase retained. Maximum height of the car was set a 45" with a target weight of 2,500 lbs. The entire center section of the car, including sculptured bubble, raise 3", then swing back electrohydraulically to allow entry. The unique front suspension is hand made and rides on 10" Mini Minor rims which are controlled by controlled b

Rich interior theme incorporates black naugahyde, walnut pan el, and burnished aluminum. S-W instruments are suspended. Gerst ner's final touch includes vivid, multi-coat candy green paint.

Judging from its enthusiastic reception, the STILLETTO is des tined to become one of the most famous of all feature cars. Mode Products Carp, will produce it in model kit form.

In the Beverly Hillbillies episode the Stiletto "may" have entered the scene under its own power. A Lot of the radical show cars of this era were "push-mobiles" meaning they were not drivable, and certainly not streetable. Judging from the way the front wheels are situated, I can't imagine it being stable at any speed. My thought is the front wheels would spread.



The Stiletto made the July 1966 issue of Car Craft Magazine (which I now have). But only 2 pages including one page featuring the picture I used on the front page of this newsletter. Also is some text and 5 black and white pictures, but no motor shot. One thing I learned from this article is that the stiletto extensions on the front of the car are removable for shipping. But also in this issue is a 4 page article with pictures of the "Just 4 Chevy Lovers" Corvair funny car with a cut-away drawing and several pictures.

The Corvair was used in many different Show Cars" over the years. Ed "Big Daddy" Roth's Road Agent below is one.





The Reactor is another Corvair based show car. Built by Gene Winfield. This made an appearance in the TV shows "Bewitched", "Star Trek", and would you believe "Batman" where it grew a tail and cat ears to become Catwoman's Kitty Car.



CONJURING UP 'THE CAR OF TOMORROW'

is a one-of-a-kind, costing \$20,000, made by custom auto stylist and builder Gene Winfield. It really runs, has a radar screen, flip-top roof, retractable fins and a 425-horsepower engine. It also has a hydraulic liquid-on-air suspension system, allowing the height to be changed from a ground height to be changed from a ground clearance of 4 inches up to 9½ inches. It was painted with subtle shades of green over lime-gold metalflake.
