CMI Meeting Minutes

March 14, 2023President Tom Quinn called the meeting to order at 7 pm.

24 members in attendance... No Corvairs

Brandberg gave a tech session regarding flywheels, as well as the pressure plates and other components.

Corvair flywheels are a 3 piece design. The original designs are cold riveted. If you have a rattling sound and you push in the clutch and it quiets, than it could be your flywheel. When your flywheel gets out of round, it will take out the pressure plate. If that happens than your ring gear can start to grind against the starter. Which will cause more problems than you really want.

A late flywheel is stepped and the early flywheels are flat.

Early model pressure plates have flat finger. Late model pressure plates have a bent finger. There are different kinds of pressure plates. Corsa and Spyders used heavier pressure plates with extra clumps of medal.





PG fluid leaks after sitting...Resolution!

A member had a leak-down in his PG after a week of sitting. So, I pencil-whipped my old solution to this classic problem. Here you see 6 sketches. First thing you want to do is order a new gasket for the PG pan and familiarizes yourself with the procedure for re-attaching the ball-end to its pocket on the internal mechanism, as you will need to do that at the end of the procedure.

1 shows the existing shift cable, so we all know what we're talking about. Shop Manual shows it this way.





In sketch #2 we see where the two main leakage points are exposed by the rising of the fluid level, after the PG sits for a while.

The fluid runs out into the shift cable – which is fine , as it lubes the cable and keeps it in fine running order.




Sketch number 3 shows how you can make the

shift cable fit inside of available shrink tubing. The tubing will only shrink to 1/3 of its original size and you want it to shrink down on the shift cable so you can't start out too big. I think I used 1" which would shrink to 3/8". In order to slip the tubing over the anchor (by the O-Ring) I had to cut off the lip of the anchor and make an L-bracket.

The rebuilt bracket will first allow for the cable anchor to be smaller! Then it will allow you to slide the tubing over the Anchor and the L-bracket will push the cable straight into the PG compressing the O-ring nicely.

If you can't see how this works, talk to me and I will draw some more pictures...because you have to do this correctly in order to make the shrink tubing idea work.



I included sketch #4 simply to help you make the bracket smooth enough to accommodate the tubing sliding over that anchor bracket. This is just as important as any other part of the idea, so we need to get that right.

Now we are getting to the part that works to seal your PG leaks! Sketch #5 shows the cable with the shrink tubing slipping over the anchor bracket and all along the shift cable. By the way, you don't have to remove the cable from the vehicle to do this - -it can be done underneath for the full operation.



Also, would be a good idea, somewhere along the line to practice slipping the ball-end up into that cute pocket they built for the ball-end. You don't want to break that Ball off. I know!


Now we get to the final sketch: You might want to read this over a few times and talk to me for clarification on any sticking points. It's not a difficult procedure but it might have parts of it that are unfamiliar to you and it would be better to talk them out beforehand!

Clean the outside of the old oily cable with starter fluid or

acetone or some other good degreaser and then smear the two feet of cable that will be protected, with the silicone

sealant – color doesn't matter. Slide the shrink tube along the cable and position it to cover the two leaking spots – then bring the heat gun to the center of the length of tubing and commence heat-shrinking from the center to each end. This will force any excess silicone out of the ends, giving you a nice smooth tubing encasing your PG shift cable and absolutely plugging the two major leaks in that cable. Once you have reattached the Ball-end of






the shift cable to its internal pivot you can employ your new 'attacher' (L-Bracket) and squash that big fat O-ring nicely! Happy CORVAIRing, as always!
