Starter Recondition Tips

When reconditioning Corvair starters over the years I have kept notes from each job for the next since I am always learning new things, either age related issues or human induced issues. The following may be useful if you are planning on your first starter job.

New parts to use: starter drive assembly, solenoid, both bushings, brushes, armature brake washer, gasket between solenoid and nose cone and any hardware items that are badly rusted or worn. The 2023 cost of an overhaul kit is \$80 plus shipping. Reconditioned starters range from \$110 to \$250 plus shipping. Expect to spend a couple of hours on cleaning, checking, replacing and painting to suit.

Bad armatures are rare but can happen. Check that all the segments are tight, not worn excessively and you can also check for opens and grounds as per the shop manual.

The case with its field winding can be checked for shorts and watch for bent, broken and worn brush holders. Check the insulation on the wiring at the brush holders. Sometimes folks assembled them with the pins behind the wire and the wire rubs on the armature.

The end cap bushings are sometimes hard to get out and sometimes they are drilled for oversize bushings. Some can be taken out with a small chisel or carefully with a 5/8 twist drill. Before installing a new bushing check the fit to the end of the armature. Some overseas suppliers have difficulties with precise dimensions as I have found several that were too tight that came in the same shipment.

The yoke that operates the drive is loose intentionally to allow for expansion and wear but check the pivot pin hole fit. You can install them backwards to use a less worn set of contact pads. Be sure the pivot pin is installed from left to right so it will not fall out if the small snap ring breaks or rusts out. I would suggest a light coat of oil on the inside of the solenoid for cars that spend a lot of time in storage because the plating on some of the new solenoids is not great and they rust.

Be sure and use the spring supplied with a new solenoid, they are matched to the winding's which have been reduced.

Lightly lube everything that is supposed to move.

Keep in mind that the first five years of shop manual starter pictures are in error. They show a big GM starter which has a different nose, drive and an assist spring. Do not use the assist spring, it was never used on original Corvair starters and finally in '65 they corrected the pictures. There is a picture nearby showing what can happen when that spring is used.

When you are ready to install the solenoid, leave the two case bolts slightly loose, loosely install the transfer strap screw, then tighten the two solenoid screws, tighten the case screws and finally the strap screw.

I have kept records of voltage drop and current draw on a test motor I use on all my rebuilds. If you have the ability to check yours on a cold engine you should get close to the following with a fully charged battery: 125-150 amps at 10.5 volts. However, not all engines are alike in compression, so cranking amps will vary. Voltage should stay above 10 for best testing.

Below is a drive assembly that shows what can happen when an unnecessary assist spring is added. The spring jumped into the collar, the fork jumped out of the collar and bent it, resulting in a jammed starter.


