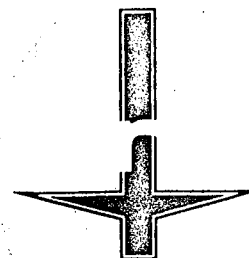

## Message from the president

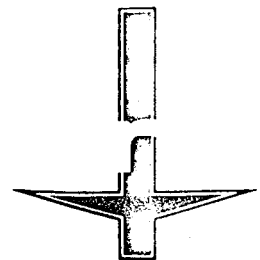
