#### **Minutes of the June Virtual Meeting**

Seven Group Corvair members logged in to the June 20 meeting at 7:30 pm. Bob Hall, president, told us about a couple from Australia (Carl Kelsen and Arlette Pat) who were currently attending the CORSA International Convention in Wisconsin and were planning to visit the Chesapeake Bay area afterward. They had attended several conventions in the past and had visited various areas in the US but had not been to our area. They were also interested in meeting some of our club members and their cars.

Byron LaMotte described the rally he has been planning in September on the eastern shore and encouraged our members to participate. He told us about some of the cars that have participated in the past, places they have stopped to eat, and the roads and sights along the way. (The Simpsons and Yates have since signed up for the rally.)

Bob started the business meeting at 7:45 pm. Minutes of the May meeting were approved as they appeared in the newsletter. Jim Simpson gave the treasurer's report – no new expenses or income in the last month.

Bob Walker reported on a race in which there were 20 Stingers starting in Indianapolis in SVRA.

Bob H. has bought several domain names (groupcorvair.com, .net, .org, .us, .club) for two years, listed as a non-profit. We are now protected against others using those domains. The next project will be to get a website. (Do we have any volunteers who know how to set up websites?)

The summer barbeque, picking up our tradition of a "Not Quite Fourth of July" picnic will be hosted by Rob Neighbour and Andrew Dan. It will be on July 16 at Andrew's house (601 Warrenton Drive, Silver Spring, MD 20904) from 2:00 to 6:00 pm. This is just off New Hampshire Ave.

Byron informed us that the Fitch Sprint will go to the Audrain Concours and Motor Week in Newport, RI, instead of his Super Spyder recreation. Since John Fitch was based in nearby Connecticut, it was felt that the Fitch Sprint would be a better fit.

Mark Shiffler told about his experience with using Jim's hydraulic press to press in the front suspension bushings and lower ball joints for his Corvair. The front suspension is now back in the car. He thinks the car might be road worthy by the end of July provided he's able to finish the engine cylinder heads. (He brought them back from the Corvair Ranch due to the backlog of work there. He's contemplating doing the valve job himself.)

There was a discussion about the length of the newsletter and what should be included in it. Jim said the next newsletter will have an article about his visit to Hastings, NE to see Chris Shady and his restoration shop, showroom, and museum.

There was a discussion on the future of new electric and gas cars.

Bob W. has had his car out and been driving it even if it still has a few issues. He had the front seats reinforced by a shop near Montgomery County Airpark; they didn't need to remove the seat covers to do the work.

Bob H.'s van is going to Mike Coale's shop to get the gas tank fixed.

Bob H., Jim, and Marolyn attended the Rockville pre-show meeting on June 6. The Rockville Antique and Classic Car Show will be on Saturday, October 14 from 11:00 am to 3:30 pm. They had July 3<sup>rd</sup> free so, on short notice, we took them to visit with Jerry and Diana Yates and to inspect the Yates's 1966 Yenko documented clone. After conversation and light refreshments Carol and I took our Australian guests to meet Jim and Marolyn Simpson and their 1966 Corsa Turbo Coupe.

The six of us (our Australian visitors, the Simpsons, and the Halls) then had a light lunch at Buddy's Crabs and Ribs on Main Street in Annapolis before we explored parts of old town, visited the Naval Academy Visitors Center, and walked around part of the Academy grounds. Then it was on across the Chesapeake Bay Bridge and to dinner at the Fisherman's Inn Restaurant on the Kent Narrows. After a good Maryland style dinner (read crab dishes) and far-ranging conversation on Corvairs, world affairs, and upcoming Corvair events we called it a night and took our Australian guests back to DC so they could get some sleep before their flight out early on July 4<sup>th</sup>. Carl will be giving a talk on the history of GM and Corvairs in Australia on July 23<sup>rd</sup> at a Chevrolet Impala Convention in Gettysburg. ## A Visit to Shade's Classic Corner

As I noted in last month's newsletter, Marolyn and I completed a 4,100+ mile road trip to the Midwest, Nebraska and South Dakota to be specific. If you are a Corvair enthusiast and are visiting Nebraska, then a stop at "Shade's Classic Corner" in Hastings is a necessity.

You may not have heard of Hastings, Nebraska before, but surely, you've heard of Kool-Aid! Yes, Kool-Aid was invented in Hastings, Nebraska, by Edwin Perkins. He did all his development in his mother's kitchen in 1927. While he moved production to Chicago in 1931, Hastings still celebrates Kool-Aid Days in the second week of

August every year. Another claim to fame for this small city in south-central Nebraska (population about 25,000) was that during WW-II, it had the nation's largest Naval ammunition plant and depot being centrally located and having excellent access to rail transportation.

Marolyn and I contacted Chris Shade a couple days before we dropped in to be sure it was convenient. He replied that he loved having visitors. We got there about 10 a.m. and spent a good two hours chatting and touring his establishment. (We didn't take written notes, so this is from memory.)



Chris operates out of a showroom on one of the main streets in town, Burlington Avenue. It's hard to miss with all the Corvairs parked out front. And the sign – now a bit weather-worn – helps as well.



These cars out front are waiting their turn for restoration. Once you are inside the crowded showroom, you'll get to see the ones waiting for a customer.

You really need to talk with Chris yourself about what he does to a Corvair to make it ready for sale. But his basic idea is to make a car fully roadworthy and then finish and customize it to the buyer's specifications.

A newly acquired Corvair will be stripped down to bare metal and all the necessary rust and damage repairs made. It will then be painted; in his experience, no one wants to buy a bare metal car. Similarly, he will go through the brakes, suspension, steering and drivetrain to ensure a safe and reliable vehicle. Once the car is roadworthy, it's up for sale.

A prospective buyer can then discuss just what they want in terms of an interior, any extra accessories, higher quality finishes, and so forth. Essentially, you as a customer, get to build a Corvair to your own taste and budget.

One resource that Chris has is McPherson College and its Automotive Restoration Technology Program. McPherson College is in Kansas, about 200 miles south of Hastings. This program was established in 1976 by a local benefactor who donated his collection of over 125 classic and antique cars – along with funding! Jay Leno helped them along when in 1997 he established the Fred S. Duesenburg and the Jay Leno Popular Mechanics Scholarships. The program turns out graduates with a bachelor's degree in Restoration Technology. Chris regularly visits to recuit personnel for his shop. As you can see in the photos, Chris has interests beyond just Corvairs. He owns, and has restored and sold, several Pontiac Fieros as well as Opel GTs. But Corvairs are the center of his work.

Beyond Corvair restorations and sales, Chris is heavily involved in sport car racing with his personal Yenko Stinger.
Hastings Motorsports Park is about 3 miles from his shop, hardly worth the effort to put his Yenko on a trailer! The Motorsports Park boasts a 2.15 mile SCCA approved road course, perfect for vintage racing and testing. To expand the

appreciation of the Yenko Stinger and other high-performance Corvairs, Chris is promoting the establishment of the "Corvair Museum of America". This would be immediately adjacent to his existing showroom and beyond promoting the "performance Corvair", would provide the community with a multi-use meeting facility.

Finally, while not directly pertinent to Chris Shade's Corvair enterprise, I think it's worthwhile to point out some other regional points of interest that you might find worth the time to visit. Lincoln, Nebraska, is about 100 miles east of Hastings on I-80. It's the home of the Museum of Speed, a 150,000 sq. ft. museum founded by the owners





of Speedway Motors, a major supplier of racing car parts. It's been voted as a #1 attraction for car lovers. It's huge, it's well laid out, and it is comprehensive. If I had any criticism, it would be it's focus on early Fords (understandable given how the Model T's and then the Flathead V8s influenced American racing) and relative lack

### **Tech Tip**

This is one from Chuck Sadek that I hadn't seen before. Besides the normal things from the factory shop manual and other normal references, Chuck notes that the engine block should be at room temperature – about 70 degrees F

when you start torquing things. That's about the temperature in the factory when they assembled the engines.
 This is important to ensure the clearances are right.

So, if you are building an engine in the winter, and your garage gets cold at night, heat the engine overnight. For instance, putting a couple incandescent light bulbs inside the engine case and then covering it with something like an old moving blanket to insulate it will warm it up ready for you to start work first thing in the morning! Just make sure you use incandescent light bulbs – LEDs won't put out enough heat. And keep the bulbs from contacting anything that could ignite – you don't need a fire!

Chuck also reminds us that when torquing the engine case, while following the shop manual sequence, between each tightening of the case bolts, rap the engine case with a rubber mallet several times in several places to get it to "settle" into position. Make sure the crank shaft turns freely before starting the next tightening sequence. Do this routinely as you tighten the bolts. Also use that rubber mallet to help settle the cylinder heads in place.


