

A Four-Way Flasher for your Corvair

By John Dinsdale- Taken from the December 1979 CORSA Communique, Submitted by Lou Trimper

The following installation is the least expensive, simplest to install, most space-saving four-way flasher modification there ever was:

Principle: Using a double-pole, single-throw switch to connect left and right front turn signal circuits together and left and right rear turn signal circuits together you can have a four-way warning flasher when this switch is turned on and either turn signal is activated.

Installation Time: About 30 minutes


List of Materials:

- 1 each DPST toggle or slide switch
- 1 each mounting panel for switch
- 16 in. 20 ga. insulated wire
- 4 each "Scotch-Locks"
- 1 each heavy-duty flasher (if car not so equipped see instructions)

Instructions:

- 1. Be sure turn signals are working properly.
- Cut wire into four equal lengths and attach to the four terminals of switch. (You may use color-coded wire in two colors if you wish.)
- Mount switch under dashboard immediately to left of steering column. (This position is optional - any other position will require more hook-up, wire.)
- Splice wires from switch to color-coded wires extending from steering column in the following manner.
 - a) Splice wire from one pole to the right-front turn signal wire (dark blue) using a Scotchblock.
 - b) Splice the left-front wire (black w/light blue stripe) to the switch terminal that completes the circuit with right-front wire connected in step a).
 - Splice wire from other pole of switch to the right-rear turn signal wire (dark green).
 - d) Splice the left-rear wire (black w/yellow stripe) to the switch terminal that completes circuit with right-rear wire connected in step c).
- Turn on switch and activate turn signal (either direction). If lights do not flash properly install a heavy-duty flasher like used in today's cars (your original equipment Corvair flasher will not work.)

Those of you who have telescopic steering wheels will want to splice into your signal wires closer to the 8-way wiring harness connector. See simplified schematic.
