

Ideas Worth Sharing - - WD-40! Adapted from a Facebook Article

Before you read to the end, does anybody know what is the main ingredient of WD-40? **No Cheating.....**

I had a neighbor who bought a new pickup. I got up very early one Sunday morning and saw that someone had spray painted red all around the sides of this beige truck (for some unknown reason). I went over, woke him up, and told him the bad news. He was very upset and was trying to figure out what to do probably nothing until Monday morning, since nothing was open. Another neighbour came out and told him to get his WD-40 and clean it off. It removed the unwanted paint beautifully and did not harm his paint job that was on the truck. I was impressed!

The product began from a search for a rust preventative solvent and degreaser to protect missile parts. WD-40 was created in 1953, by three technicians at the San Diego Rocket Chemical Company. Its name comes from the project that was to find a Water Displacement Compound. "Water Displacement #40"!

They were finally successful for a formulation, with their fortieth attempt; thus WD-40. The Convair Company bought it in bulk to protect their atlas missile parts. Ken East (one of the original founders) says there is nothing in WD-40 that would hurt you.

When you read the "shower door" part, try it. It's the first thing that has ever cleaned that spotty shower door. If yours is plastic, it works just as well as on glass. It's a miracle! Then try it on your stove-top. It's now shinier than it's ever been. You'll be amazed!

WD-40 Uses:

- 1. Protects silver from tarnishing.
- 2. Removes road tar and grime from cars.
- 3. Cleans and lubricates guitar strings.
- 4. Gives floor that 'just-waxed' sheen without making them slippery.
- 5. Keeps the flies off of Cows, Horses, and other Farm Critters.
- 6. Restores and cleans chalkboards.
- 7. Removes lipstick stains.
- 8. Loosens stubborn zippers.
- 9. Untangles jewellery chains.
- 10. Removes stains from stainless steel sinks.
- 11. Removes dirt and grime from the barbecue grill.
- 12. Keeps ceramic/terracotta garden pots from oxidising.
- 13. Removes tomato stains from clothing.
- 14. Keeps glass shower doors free of water spots.
- 15. Camouflages scratches in ceramic and marble floors.
- 16. Keeps scissors working smoothly.
- 17. Lubricates noisy door hinges on both home and vehicles doors.
- 18. It removes that nasty tar and scuff marks from the kitchen flooring. It doesn't seem to harm the finish and you won't have to scrub nearly as hard to get them off.

 Just remember to open some windows if you have a lot of marks.

- 19. Remove those nasty bug guts that will eat away the finish on your car, if not removed quickly!
- 20. Gives a children's playground gym slide a shine for a super fast slide.
- 21. Lubricates gearshift and mower deck lever for ease of handling on riding mowers.
- 22. Rids kids rocking chair and swings of squeaky noises.
- 23. Lubricates tracks in sticking home windows and makes them easier to open.
- 24. Spraying an umbrella stem makes it easier to open and close.
- 25. Restores and cleans padded leather dashboards in vehicles, as well as vinyl bumpers.
- 26. Restores and cleans roof racks on vehicles.
- 27. Lubricates and stops squeaks in electric fans.
- 28. Lubricates wheel sprockets on tricycles, wagons and bicycles for easy handling.

- 31. Removes grease splatters from stove-tops.

The Rear View Mirror By Jack Allison

On November 14, 1970, a chartered jet carrying most of the Marshall University football team clipped a stand of trees and crashed into a hillside, just two miles from the Tri-State Airport in Kenova, West Virginia, killing everyone onboard. The team was r returning from that day's game, a 17–14 loss to East Carolina University.

This crash killed 75 people: 37 players of the Marshall University "Thundering Herd" football team, 5 coaches, 2 athletic trainers, 2 doctors, the athletic director, 25 boosters, and the airplane crew of five. The "boosters" included some of Huntington, West Virginia's most prominent citizens, who had traveled to North Carolina to cheer on the "Thundering Herd". A citizen of Huntington wrote later, "The whole fabric, the whole heart of the town was aboard."

This is a photo of the Marshall University Cheerleaders during a dismal, overcast night November 14, are awaiting the return of the Marshall players who had just lost to E. Carolina State, not knowing that tragedy had struck.

The Corvair you see here was rented to the production company filming



the re-enactment movie, "We are Marshall".

This particular segment was filmed in Atlanta. Corvair Atlanta member, Ted Worley, is the car's owner.

If I am not mistaken, the movie is still available for rental. Keep a tissue handy if you watch it.




On Facebook, someone posted a photo of his Corvair with a roof rack installed. A guy posted a response that the roof rack was not a standard GM option.

New parts: Distributor and coil, electric fuel pump and regulator, battery, master cylinder, and wheel brake cylinder.

It cranks and runs good. Top is like new. All of the glass, emblems, and chrome need no restoration. The body is in good shape with no dents or rust. As far as the paint



goes - it is plenty good enough for a driver, but maybe not be slick enough for a show-winner.



The only problem - it needs a total brake job. Recently, one of the wheel cylinders started leaking, so I decided to replace it and the master cylinder. 
