Gettysburg-More Than A Civil War Battlefield

Did you know that Gettysburg has ties to World War II?

The town has a long list of World War II ties: president and D-Day commander Dwight D. Eisenhower maintained a home there. It was also the site of a secret U.S. Navy mapmaking office, an army psychological warfare training camp and a POW camp on the Civil War battlefield where German prisoners worked picking fruits and vegetables. Gettysburg has applied for American World War II Heritage City status from the National Park Service.

There's a new museum in Gettysburg that doesn't tell any of the Civil War stories that we hear all over town—it tells the stories of the involvement of this Civil War town during a much more recent war, World War II.

Frank Buck and his wife Loni invested over \$7 million dollars to construct three 12,000-square-foot buildings on 30 acres of farmland near their home about five miles north-west of Gettysburg. that contain everything from Sherman tanks and other vehicles to a collection of World War II uniforms, helmets and weapons on display.

Near the end of 2023, Frank sadly passed away leaving this amazing museum to his family. The family plans to continue operations with little impact to tourists. Check out The World War II American Experience, which is located at 845 Crooked Creek Road in Gettysburg, Pa 17325. https://visitww2.org/

Our Louis Chevrolet Award Winner!


We're kicking off our new format with an award-winner! Almost one year ago, one of MMCC's members, William (Bill) Hubbell won the award for his restored John Glenn Corvair.

This car is just out of this world... or, at least its original owner was: John Glenn, in 1964 the first American in orbit, and 1988, the oldest. By the time Bill purchased this Corvair Monza in 2001, it had been off the road for more than 20 years. It featured poor paint in the wrong color, had a wrong top, and was missing trim; in short, it was a complete beater. It had gone through three more owners after Glenn sold it, one of then was a NASA engineer. Another 15 years in Bill's ownership transpired before its restoration began in 2017. Bill did all of his own work other than body work and paint. The top-of-the-line Monza features the optional 165cid/110hp six-cylinder engine, automatic transmission, factory air-conditioning, remote control mirror, and fully tinted glass.



Here's how the AACA magazine described the event that was held in Williamsburg, VA-- When the many activities, seminars, presentations and get-togethers were all said and done, it was time for the "Oscars of the Antique Automobile World" to take place.

On Saturday evening, the owners of many fabulous (62 this year) national award-winning cars arrived en masse with the excitement and pageantry of being personally presented with their well-deserved awardsThe banquet room was spectacular, set up with the usual dual projection screens that presented the recipient's winning automobile with West Peterson giving verbal histories of each car while the car owners went up to receive their well-deserved award. The convention board will provide assistance to event team leads if there would be a need. The convention board will also assist the event team lead with approval of monetary items once reviewed by the board and when/if approved, added to our CORSA budget.

Once the event team leads are in place, we will begin to solicit for volunteers. Volunteers can select the event(s) that they would like, and the times they are available for those events. Once the list of volunteers has been developed for an event, then that list will be sent to the event team leader.

Again, we know that there are some of you that would really want to help in a particular event, but don't want "the headaches" that may go with being the team lead. So, if you would like to help us to get things started and then "pass the baton" to someone else and just be a volunteer for the event, that could be worked out as well. Note that at least three event team leaders will work with someone from CORSA.


