2024 Mel Horstman Award Rules

Objective of the Mel Horstman Award:

For MCCA members to drive their Corvairs to club events.

Events that qualify for the award:

Members who drive their Corvairs to:

- Regular MCCA meetings
- Club-sponsored events
- Club-sponsored road trips
- Lake Afton
- Cars & Coffee on non-Tuna dates.
- Club-sponsored participation in Parades
- Club-sponsored monthly A designated Friday Night Cruise-In
- Other events specifically designated in-advance by majority vote of MCCA officers

Specific events that do not qualify for the award

- Tunas
- National or Regional Conventions
- Other events specifically

excluded in-advance by majority vote of MCCA officers

One point per event, per family who drive their Corvairs.

An MCCA officer will document an official Corvair count at each qualifying event. If an MCCA officer cannot be present at an event, an MCCA member will be designated to document the official Corvair count.

In the event of tie names will be drawn from a hat, overseen by an MCCA officer.

Start date to begin counting points for the eighth Mel Horstman Award is January 1, 2023. The award period is January 1 through December 31.

Where I Found My Corvair

It all started with a phone call from Steve Goodman in early 2005. Steve told me someone in Denver contacted him about some Corvairs in Collyer, KS that her parents wanted to sell. One was a low mileage Greenbrier that Steve thought I would be interested in.

After checking on a map where Collyer was (a little over 200 miles from Wichita on West I-70) I contacted the owners. There were three Corvairs they wanted to sell as a package, the low mileage Greenbrier, a Rampside and a EM convertible.

I wasn't prepared to purchase three Corvairs at that time, so I shared my plight with MCCA members. Jim Dallas said he was interested in the Rampside and we could go partners on the convertible.

An appointment was made, Jim and I headed West to check out the Corvairs and negotiate a deal. The FCs were stored in a barn and from the layer of dust and cobwebs they had been there for awhile. Luckily the barn had a wood floor so they were in pretty good shape. We were able to make a deal with the husband on the three Corvairs. He headed into the house to get the titles. When he returned and talked to his partner, he told us the offer wasn't good enough. We upped the offer \$100 per car on the condition it wouldn't go any higher. That made the deal work.

The next task was to figure out how to get the three Corvairs back to Wichita. To fetch the FCs I could borrow my Uncle's car hauler, put one on the hauler and another on a trailer behind it. Bernie Strecker offered to borrow a trailer and bring the Convertible home behind his pickup. It made an interesting sight Corvair caravaning down I-70.

Once I got the Greenbrier to my shop I needed to get it road worthy and figure out why it had been parked. With a lot of help from Duane Grimm and Alex Moats the brake and fuel systems were cleaned and overhauled. Once the engine was fired it was quite apparent why it had been parked, a pronounced knock. Although it sounded a lot like rod knock, I was able to Isolate it down to a failed flywheel. With a rebuilt unit from Mike Dawson the Greenbrier was back on the road.

February Road Trip To Hutch Salt Mine

The February MCCA Road Trip starts at 9 am February 24 with members meeting at the Quick Trip at 2954 Maize Rd, Maize, KS. Once the group has gathered they will continue Northwest to Hutchinson. There members will get a guided tour of Strataca, the salt mine museum in Hutchinson, Kansas. It was previously known as the Kansas Underground Salt Museum. The museum is located at 3650 E Ave G, Hutchinson, KS. The original salt mine was built within one of the world's largest deposits of rock salt. The vain of salt was formed 275 million years ago, and located 650 feet beneath the Earth's surface.

To quote the museum's web site, "At Strataca we are passionate about providing all of our visitors with the adventure and memories to last a lifetime. The mine is filled with unique experiences and decades of history that you can only get 650 feet below this small Kansas town." It takes about 90 seconds to descend from the surface to the former mining area. There are about 150 miles of tunnels where the salt was mined. The tour will take about two hours.

Their website adds, "Everyone who walks through our doors becomes a part of our underground community. Make memories underground that you and your family will hold close and cherish forever. Join the adventure, book your tour today!"
