In Memory of Dr. Kevin Koch.

Kevin was a HACOIA member and wonderful friend for 35 years; losing him March 14 was extremely sad after we all had followed his struggle with cancer for over two years. He constantly applauded his wife Ada for her care-giving during that difficult time and he completed his final days with great dignity.

I met Kevin and Ada when they came by the Small Car Shop that Charlie Clark and I operated in Lenexa. That was in the fall of 1989 when they had just moved to Kansas City where Kevin began his long career with the Shawnee-Mission Hospital Emergency Room. He was looking for an auto repair shop where he could have his late model Monza convertible serviced when necessary, and I was delighted to have a new customer who shared my love of all things Corvair! The Koch's quickly joined HACOIA and over the next three decades Kevin owned multiple Corvair cars and one Rampside. He kept the Rampside for over 30 years, driving it to car shows, parades and even moving artwork for Ada. Kevin always selected close-to-original vehicles, finding satisfaction searching history, finding parts and bringing the cars up to their full potential. The last two Corvairs in the Koch garage are the '63 Rampside and the more recent '65 Monza sedan that Kevin devoted much love to, including adding A/C and a doors-off paint job.

Over the years Kevin served HACOIA in many capacities; he prepared numerous local history tours, served on committees, held the office of President in 1994 & 1995 and all the attendees will remember the wonderful socials that he and Ada sponsored. Their home in Prairie Village was the site of Christmas parties for several years before they downsized back to the Plaza area. Kevin put on many meeting programs where he provided Corvair themed history, useful medical information and my favorite: *Tales From the Emergency Room*.

I feel so privileged to have been Kevin's chief Corvair mechanic and great friend for all those years, but I find it tragic that Kevin saved so many lives over the course of his career but in the end his profession could not save his. Perhaps his treatments provided feedback for cures in the future.

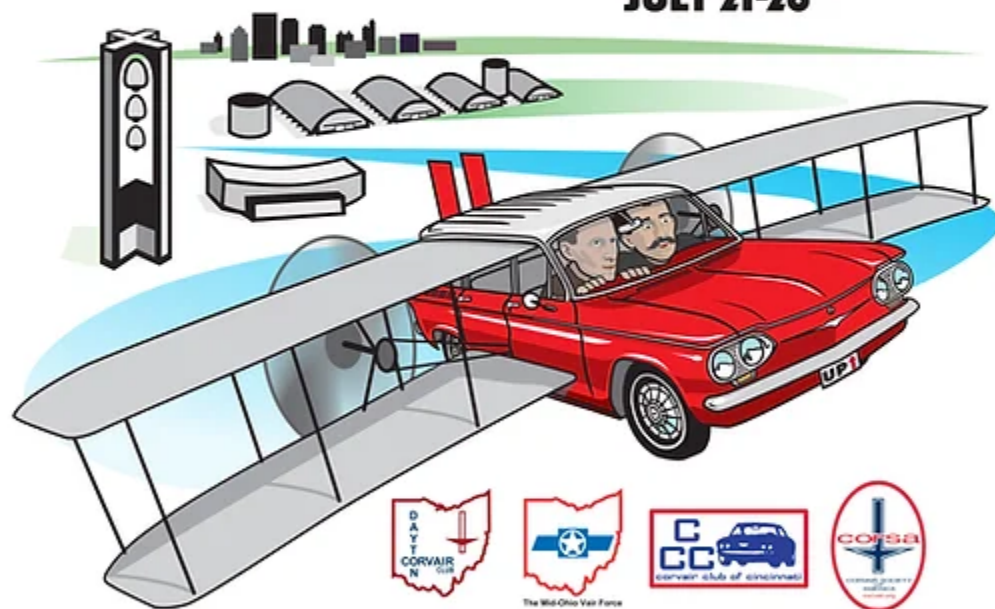

BE IT KNOWN that we the undersigned being natural persons of the age of twenty-one (21) years or more for the purposes of forming a corporation not for profit under the provisions of Chapter 355.010 under "The General Not For Profit Corporation Law", do hereby adopt the following Articles of Incorporation.

I

The name of the corporation will be HEART OF AMERICA CORVAIR OWNERS ASSOCIATION, INC.

II

The address of its initial registered office in the State of Missouri is 5705 North Michigan, Kansas City North 18, Missouri and the name of its initial registered agent at such address is Robert Eugene Caldwell.

III

The general purpose of the corporation is to form a club of Corvair automobile owners to create and plan organized trips, events and social activities for members of the club, to provide and regulate events and exhibits for club members and Corvair owners and to encourage careful and skillful driving on the public streets and highways and to to all other acts on a social basis related to said club and to do any and all other things related to said organization under the powers of the General Not For Profit Corporation Law.

The corporation shall be of perpetual existence.

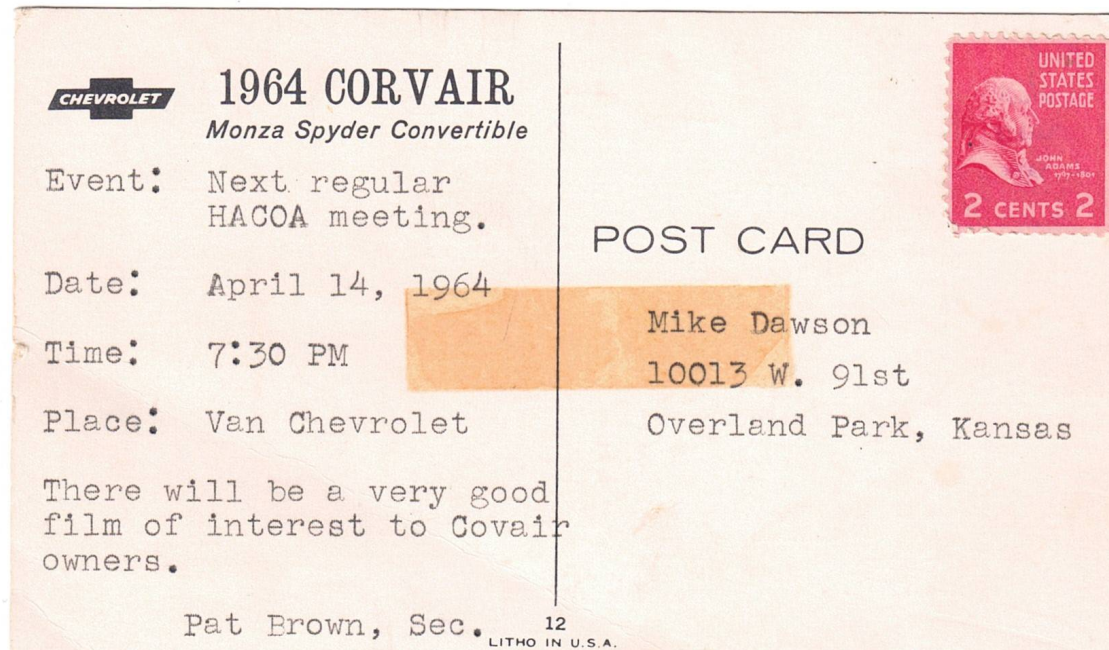

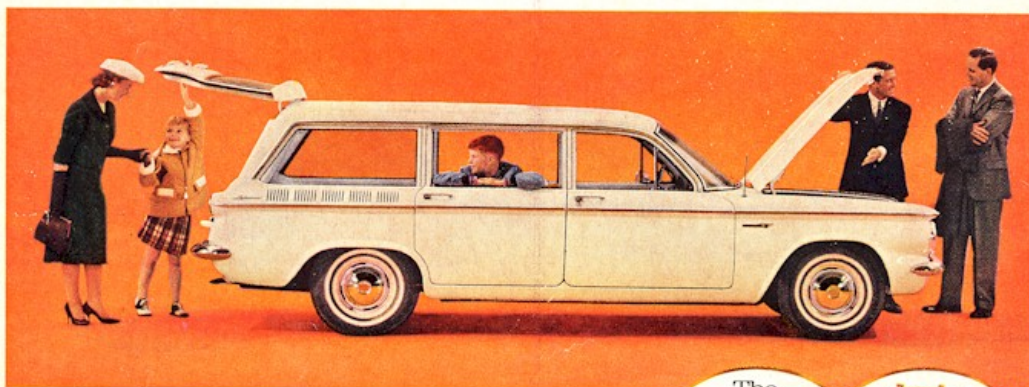
