Where I Found My Corvair

I had the opportunity to meet a few HACOA members in 2005 while assisting a co-worker on her father's 1961 Corvair. The wonderful interaction and support I found in HACOA and MCCA led to me hunt down my very own Corvair early in 2006. It was a Craigslist find located in Independence, MO. This was only about 15 miles from my house so I had to check it out. There were no camera phones in my possession at that time so the only picture I have of it prior to the purchase is the one from the ad. It was sitting outside of a single car garage, and had been in the same spot for many years.

The car was a 1965 Corsa in Racing Red. The badges, 140hp motor, and manual transmission were all there. Although it was unmolested, with decent interior, it did have a fair amount of rust in not good places. I am saddened to say that I have absolutely no recollection around how I got it home that spring day. It did not run, had no brakes, rotten tires, and half of the KC Zoo reptile exhibit inhabiting the interior. Somehow it did find its way to my driveway in Grain Vallev and after a bath and extermination it didn't look too awful.

It only took a few weeks to get the valves adjusted, brakes sorted out, install an operating transmission, replace a few bent pushrods, rebuild the carburetors, sort out the 140 linkage, and cleaning out of the gas tank before it was running again. During that time I met Terry Kalp as he came forward with a

used '65 4-speed transmission and I became better acquainted with Mike Dawson while he was patient enough to educate me on the uniqueness's of the Corvair. Once it was moving under its owner power again it was obvious why it had been parked. I still have the valve seat that refused to stay in the location that GM designated. After being fully inducted into the Corvair world I knew that the engine had to come out and be rebuilt. You are looking at rebuild number one as of now 30 and soon to be 32.

The pistons (none cracked), cylinders, crank, and cam were all acceptable so the only major work was to the heads which Tom Noland took care of. This would be beginning of a long and fruitful relationship. By July I was attending local car shows and then in September was ready for my first road trip in a Corvair to Tulsa, OK and my first Roundup. The car did great to and from Tulsa and actually looked pretty good, as long as one didn't look too closely.

The car has since gone on to Florida via an EBay auction. Last I heard it's still moving about in the warmer climate. I had so much fun working on this Corvair that I purchased my second Corvair with a known dropped valve seat and had it shipped from Arizona. Once I jumped in I don't know that I've gotten out of the deep end of the pool yet..
