Hi campers!

The old adage that says "you learn something new every day" is still alive and well. I was fortunate enough to buy a set of 14" alloy wheels from one of the clubs "take apart" Corvairs. I assumed that they would fit my car because they came off an early model. I then had them media blasted, and powder coated gloss black. Not too Spenny but I winced by reflex when handing over the money. I sent a picture of them to Bob Wittmann because I was so proud. Bob then talked me through all the things I should have checked before plunking down my money. Spoiler alert, they are going to work! It hadn't even crossed my mind that they may have been put on that car just to keep it off the ground. Bottom line, I got lucky. Width from outside to outside was the first to measure. Mine turned out to be 6-3/4". This checks out. The inside-to-inside measurement was 6". One bullet dodged. Backspace was next. I measured from the mounting face to the innermost edge of the rim. This dimension was 4-1/2" I checked this against the stock spare tire in my car. It measured the same. Second bullet dodged. Pilot diameter (center hole) was next. My new rims measured roughly 2-3/4". It was hard to get accurate with a tape measure. This is when Bob told me about "hub-centric vs. bolt-centric. The wheel is designed to fit on the bearing hub assembly. This transfers the weight of the vehicle directly to the hub. That way, the lug nuts and studs aren't being stressed trying to do a job they weren't meant to do, i.e. Holding up the car and dealing with road imperfections. Looks like I'll have to order some wheel adapter rings to help take up the space and support the car. Not the end of the world. Third bullet dodged. Wheel studs were next on the discussion table. Alloy rims are thicker than stock, so they take up more room on the stud, allowing the lug nut less of a purchase. A good way to gage whether you need new studs would be to count the turns of the lug nut before it contacts the rim. 7/16x20 studs would need ten full turns to have 1/2" of engagement. Any less and it would be considered a no-go situation. Bob had the part number for the longer wheel studs. (Dorman 610-259) They have a 1-3/4" overall length. This allows adequate purchase for the lug nuts. Fourth bullet dodged. By this time, I'm feeling like Neo in "The Matrix", all bullet dodging like a digital ninja! There are also special tools that can be borrowed or bought to press out the old studs without hitting them (and the bearing) with a big hammer. My next step is to mount a bare rim on the front and back just to make sure that it doesn't hit anything, when turning, as it is a thicker material. This is on the to-do list but needs to be done before buying tires. I'm really thankful for the talk through this potential mine field. It could have been disastrous or dangerous, I seriously learned something new **today**. I also got really lucky. Bottom line, stay safe and happy Corvairing. Peace, Tom. ■

WHRRR club race weekend 1 by Chris Hand

Two Hand Racing showed up with 2 Corvairs kind of ready for the track, I don't think a vintage car is ever ready. We went out for qualifying Saturday morning, my car felt weird, and I just wasn't comfortable in the car, nothing felt right and the car just wouldn't handle with a bad mid-range hesitation and the brakes were shaking worse than a hooker in church. I came in after about 10 laps and so did my dad. Aftermath of qualifying was he dropped a valve seat and was done for the weekend, and I started trying to figure out what was wrong with my car or if it was just me. There's nothing I can do about my brakes this weekend, the steering and handling we did a shake down and didn't see anything. Did all of normal checks and got ready for the race.

Race 1 Saturday afternoon:

Not much to report, car handled about the same as before, I changed a couple things in my driving style and picked up a couple seconds from my qualifying time and gibbous the race. This weekend is the first time in a long time they did a Co-Driver race where drivers can switch cars and run a race. I get back to the pits after impound and my dad said he signed up for it in my car. I wanted to change rear tires to see if that would help with my handling, so my awesome crew started working on all our checks and the swap over, had to be done in less than 15 minutes. We completed it as the cars were heading out on track.



Coming to grid late isn't the best scenario, he didn't get to do the warmup lap, and had a shot gun start from pit lane when the green dropped. Thankfully I had just got done and the car was already warmed up, except the rear tires. It was fun watching my dad try to handle my ill handling car and got the verification I needed that something is definitely wrong.

Lying in bed going over all the stuff I had done in the last week it occurred to me that the right rear spring had falling out when we changed out the powertrain. Sure enough that darn spring wasn't in the perch like it should've been. Fixed that, adjusted the accelerator pumps a little, and changed my tire pressures a little.

Race 2 Sunday morning:

Forecast called for no rain, but it misted all morning putting a little moisture in the air and on the track. Nobody went to rains, there was no standing water on the track. This run felt much better, my times were up 2 more seconds a lap and I felt like a race car driver again until the tires got hot and brought me back to reality. Hesitation still there, and the handling felt about 50% better.



Race 3 Sunday afternoon:

Nothing much to report I just went out and put in laps. I'm going to have some making up on points as I came in second place all weekend, but I have 5 more race weekends to figure it out.

Our next race is May 25/26th, I'm looking into some high performance S10 rotors, they're actually kind of hard to find not drilled. I found EBC makes them slotted and dimpled, but you gotta pay up for them and it's about a 3-week delivery time. I'm going to pull my front clip off and re-inspect my front suspension and double check my alignment. I feel like something major has changed, maybe it's just last year's tires, but I've driven on tires older than this and not had these problems.



Overall, not a horrible weekend for me, my goal was for my car to make and finish every race which it did plus a bonus co-driver race. ■

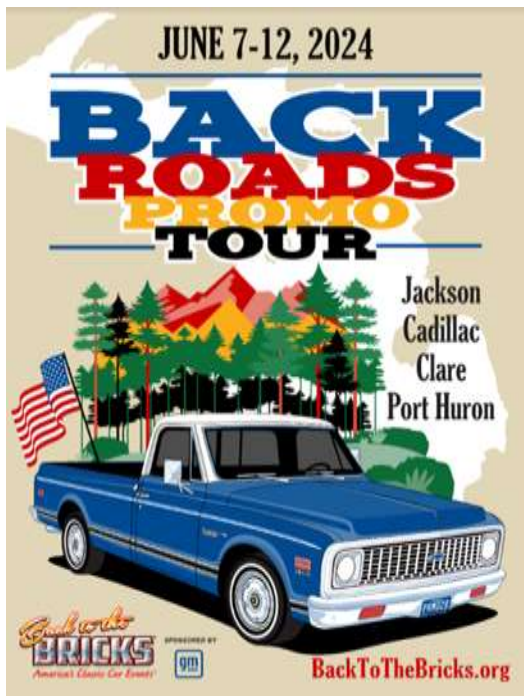
