He explains all about the Corvair in less than two minutes flat! Lots of room, good traction, easy to see out of, easy to maneuver and most of all, ready for delivery today. He then asks if they would like to take delivery today? No doubt, Dr Q is living up to his name. But...the Jones' have questions.

Concerned, Mr. Jones wants to see the engine and some features. So, Dr Q (quick to oblige) opens the front hood to discover no engine! He says to them, "Just kidding" the engine is in the back I recall." He proceeds to the car's rear, fumbles around for the latch and pops it open. Mr. Jones is now very anxious, "What the heck is this?" Dr Q says, "the engine location is good for traction, less noise and a lot more interior room." Besides, Dr Q offers the opinion that soon all cars will have their engines in the back. "Is this the only available color?" Mrs. Jones asks. "I don't like the color. Could we maybe reorder what we like?" Dr Q, tight on his monthly sales quota, demurs and states he can make a real good deal on this particular car including the optional gas heater. Mr. Jones asks, "Why doesn't it have a regular water heater?" Dr Q states, "This heater is faster and besides the engine doesn't use water as it cools with air." Mr. Jones is dumbfounded. They start by driving out of the parking lot right by Slippery's Bar (Dr Q's lunch time haunt) and proceed down the road to the cul-de-sac where Mattie Gotsha lives (Mrs. Jones best friend). After their demo drive Dr Q is confident the deal is near complete. There is an old auto sales belief "Get them in the car and they will buy it." # Corvair Tech Tips Repairing Your Sun Visors

Is the binding coming off of the edge of your sun visors?

Both of the sun visor bindings stitching had deteriorated, and the binding was hanging down. I tried using contact cement to reattach them and that lasted a very short time till they were detached and hanging loose again. So, I figured it was time to take them to an upholstery shop and get them repaired correctly. The first shop said it took a special machine to sew the original binding back on and he didn't have one and suggested that I Super Glue it back on. I didn't think that was a great idea, so I went to a different shop and was told the same thing about a special machine to repair the original binding and that he knew of no one that had one.

He said he could sew a new binding on, but it would look different and would be larger. He then told me to super glue it back on and that was how they repaired them. I told him that I had tried contact cement and that it did not hold. He then told me contact cement was for large flat surfaces only.

He then brought out three bottles of the product that they use, and they have never had one come back. They were heavy gel, accelerator and remover.

Since this is the product that the professionals use, I decided to buy it on Amazon for \$22.00.

#### Directions:

- . Wipe the visor and binding with rubbing alcohol to remove any polish or protectant.
- Do one side at a time starting at one end using a small amount on 2 inches at a time.
- Press and wipe the seam with a paper towel to remove any glue that may squeeze out. Then hold for 20-30 seconds.
- Now go to the other end and do the same. Repeat this process going back and forth until you have the one seam on one side of the visor completely glued.
- . Now flip it over and repeat the same process on the second side.

If you need to use the remover, use it very cautiously as it can do damage to the vinyl. Do not put it directly on the surface. Put it on a paper towel and rub it quickly.

Do not use a clamp as this tends to pull the binding away from the visor body. Twenty to thirty seconds of squeezing by hand works best.

If you would like to see the finished product, let me know and I will bring it to our meeting.




