There were lots of Corvairs, projects, food, folks and fellowship at the June 1st HACOA Working Tech Session & Front Yard Car Show. The Saturday, event began at Noon and ran until all the projects were finished. Mike and Sandy hosted everyone at their Belton, MO home and shop.

Terry Kalp and Mike B. made the trip from Valley Center to Belton, arriving at Dawsons' around 10:30. There were already several folks there getting an early start on projects. Mike B. met up with his son and took out to pick up and deliver some parts in Kansas City. Terry was picked up by Scott Allison and Keith Hammett for lunch at Jimmie John's.

Projects included: a '60 gas tank swap, a starter replacement, turn signal repair, headlight aiming, pulling the heads on a parts engine, a pittman arm bushing replacement, plus Mike Dawson balanced and tuned several sets of Corvair carburetors.

By around 5 the hamburgers and hot dogs were ready, the tables set up and the line formed for the evening meal. There was an excellent assortment of side dishes and desserts available.

Terry had brought long a handful of 2024 Great Plains Corvair Roundup registrations and envelopes which were picked up by HOCO members.

Where I Found My Corvair

While sorting out my first Corvair, the 1965 Corsa featured in the April 2024 FlatSix Journal, I found that I was in need of a transmission. I put a note out on corvairstercenter/phorum, now known as Corvair Center Forum hosted by CORSA, that I needed a 65 4-speed transmission. A reply came in pretty quickly from a guy in Wichita who went by tkalp. He invited me down to his shop, which I assumed was like the other shops I'd seen to that point, indicating that he likely had what I was looking for.

It was May 28, 2006 when my father and I climbed into my 2006 Dodge Charger and headed out for Wichita with the transmission in the trunk. I had no idea what a "Valley Center" was, I'd never been further west of Kansas City than Olathe, but my father spent many years in Kansas during his working days so he was the perfect companion for the trip. I blocked the whole day because I thought we may be leaving and returning in the

dark. This was well before I made Google Maps my friend.

We arrived at the "Kalp Compound" in a short 3 hours, to my surprise, and were greeted by Terry Kalp and Ned Madsen. Terry was a gracious host and showed us both around answering my father's many questions about the vast collection. Knowing nothing about Corvair transmissions I was comparing the one I brought with an assortment of others Terry had

available. I consider it luck that I didn't end up loading a non-synchronized 3-speed in the trunk of the car but I don't think Terry would have let me.

After selecting a transmission I was going to catch up with Terry and my dad but there was one car calling out to me that I couldn't stop looking at. The car was a 1966 Corsa in Daytona Sunset Orange Metallic with black interior

in the row of cars in the back half of the shop. I actually don't recall many of the others, though there were many more than I expected, because I was so enthralled by the color, stance, and elegance that I saw in the '66 Corsa. Ned noticed my drooling and walked up and had only two words for me, "good luck". Then we stood there while Ned pointed out the features of the car that I hadn't recognized as features being new to the Corvair world. Terry soon joined us and found additional features that Ned either hadn't gotten to yet or didn't know about the car.

I don't recall when exact Terry first acquired the car but here's a story which he recapped for me a couple years ago. "It came from Ottawa, KS had been a father and son project that had gotten wrecked (Driver's front fender) it was a not so great gray when I got it.

Terry pointed out that a '66 Corsa with factory A/C was pretty rare and finding the '66 only headrest seats and installing them into the car (even if they didn't actually come with the car originally) only added to the list of special features. I didn't care about any of that and simply that it was one of the best looking Corvairs I had ever seen.

I visited Wichita for the Tunas 3 times a year between May of 2026 and October of 2021, some years with additional trips for fun, and there wasn't a time when I didn't peek in on "GT" and ask Terry if he was ready to sell it yet. I was fully aware that I couldn't afford the car but it's always nice to have goals. Suddenly, doing the normal dance, in October

of 2021 the answer was not the normal grin but rather an "I'm thinking about something and will let you know soon". It was November of 2021 when I got an email from Terry that said "I have been thinking about the '66 Corsa" along with an offer that I never expected and one that I couldn't resist.

The following weekend my brother-in-law and I hooked up the trailer and headed down for the day. Terry again was again a super host for Phil and after showing him around the Kompound we headed over the Valley Center shop to see the Fieros and the works of art amidst the space. After lunch at one of my favorite places, Big Larry's, Phil and I headed back to Belton with my dream car in tow. The day was great and obviously not something I will forget any time soon.

I didn't mind waiting the 15 years and the anticipation only makes me appreciate it more today. I matured in my knowledge of Corvairs and believe that I'm in a position to be a better caretaker of the car that I would have been any time before. I hope to always do right by the car and enjoy it for many more years. Being allowed to be the keeper of this car for the time being is a dream come true for me.

I had brought along some 2024 Great Plains Roundup registrations and envelopes. Several COCA members picked up the envelopes and vowed to register.

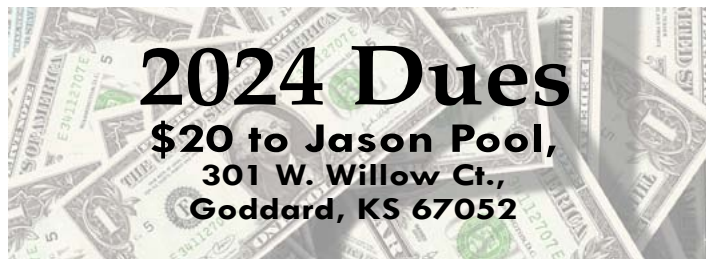
