## Air Conditioner Upgrade by Bill Vellner

My Corvair came with factory A/C, but the compressor pulley disintegrated, and I had to remove the compressor belt. Rather than rebuild the compressor, I decided to upgrade the system and convert it to R134A. In addition, I didn't like the stock condenser location since it pre-heated the air for the engine. After looking at the body contours in the engine compartment, I decided to locate the condenser in the right rear quarter panel with vents to the outside. In addition, I added electric fans to draw air through the condenser. I added relays to keep high currents from the A/C switch in the dash. Parts were ordered from Clark's Corvair and included a new Sanden compressor. Vents were cut in the quarter panel and behind the rear wheel to insure adequate air flow through the condenser. Sheet metal panels were fabricated to direct the air flow. The pictures show the progression to the final installation.



## Modifying my engine by Bill Vellner

After modifying my engine for more power, I felt that more oil cooler capacity would help the engine reliability since Corvair engines are oil cooled as well as air cooled. In keeping with the A/C upgrade (see previous article) I put a matching vent in the left rear quarter panel. The battery was rotated 90 degrees to make room for the larger oil cooler. Just like the A/C upgrade, I used an electric fan to pull air through the cooler. A 160-degree sensor was mounted at the cooler output to switch the fan on if the oil temperature exceeded that. An oil cooler bypass thermostat was mounted ahead of the cooler to allow the oil to come up to operating temperature quicker. After using the cooler for a while, I noticed some swelling on the input line to the cooler. I realized that failure there would be both messy and catastrophic for the engine. That was when I decided to spend the extra money and upgrade to AN fittings. The pictures show my progression and the difference between a stock oil cooler and the larger unit. ■
