There were 1338 cars at the show, the numbers were down due to the rain forecast. There have been as many as 2400 cars at this show. There is no judging, you pay your entry fee and show up. About 5:00 they have a cruise down main street until 10:00. They clear main of all cars for 5-6 blocks. You can cruise, park, cruise again, park, cruise as much as you want. I would guess there are around 3000 people lining the street to watch the cars.

If you have never been I highly recommend attending this show. There is literally one of everything at this show. We met several of the HACOA members at the show. There was a Rampside, an early station wagon shorty, a 65 sedan and our two cars representing the Corvair community.




