# Cheap Rust Removal by Darin Wink

If any of you are like me and you have more time than \$\$\$\$, then I hope you know what a good rust removal job normal grocery store white vinegar can do. At \$3 a gallon, you can't get much more affordable.

Parts must be kept submerged and a cheap aquarium heater will accelerate the chemical reaction. Once desired results are achieved, then a soak in a base solution like baking soda water for approximately 1/2 the time of the vinegar soak. This is required to neutralize the acid that may have leached into the good metal. If this is not done then the items will flash rust immediately on hitting the oxygen in the air.

Vinegar will evaporate at the same rate as water, so covering your soaking container will help with retention. If cost is the "pro", then time is the "con".

The pictured wheel was submerged for three weeks total (two weeks in vinegar and one week in a neutralizing solution of baking soda water). I can't emphasize enough that no scrubbing was necessary. All you will be left with is whatever good steel/cast iron you started with.

The acetic acid of vinegar chemically changes any ferrous oxide (rust) into ferrous acetate (a salt) and hydrogen gas. Many of us have projects going where time is plentiful and parts are just laying around on shelves waiting. I've tried to add value to this idle part time by soaking parts in advance so they are ready for installation when I need them.

#### **Zolatone Your Trunk** by Lee Olsen

One year ago, I was able to get my Yenko Stinger #44 back after selling it in 2006. The car was just as it was when sold it. The interior still smelled the same as when I finished restoring it. The only issue was that the splatter paint that I had applied in the trunk with rattle cans 23 years ago was flaking off. A respray was needed.

After researching, I determined that a product called Zolatone was the best quality paint to replicate the factory applied paint. I purchased a quart for around \$70. The application

instructions recommended a pressure pot sprayer, I don't have one of those and they are expensive. Further research showed that a spray gun with a 2. 0 mm spray tip could also be used. I purchased an inexpensive gravity feed gun from Amazon to use.

Zolatone is a strange paint. It is somewhat grainy from the small paint balls that give the finished product the splatter effect.

The instructions call for a light coat to be applied at 50 psi with the needle screwed in for a light coat, let it dry then apply the topcoat with the needle opened up at 20 PSI. Everything was going OK with the topcoat until the gun quit spraying. I dumped the paint back in the can, unscrewed the cup and found the small plastic filter under the cup was plugged. I pitched the filter and rinsed the gun with starting fluid to clean out all passages.

After this procedure, the gun worked great, and my trunk turned out great. If you are considering painting or repainting a trunk, I would recommend Zolatone. It is a very durable hard finish that looks great.

#### Corvair Wintertime Storage By Ken Hand

There is a lot of misunderstanding on what people should do

to store a car for the winter time. First, you should do a normal service on the car like change the oil, grease the front end, check the air in the tires. Second, figure out where you are going to store the car for the winter and once that is accomplished and you have the car parked in its spot, roll the front windows down about 1 ", go to the rear and disconnect the battery, and if you have a cover, put it on now.

Each person may have their own little thing they like to do extra, but these are the basic things that should be done. One other note: once you park the car for the winter, it is actually better NOT to start the car until you are ready to drive it in the Spring.

Early Fuel Pumps have Longer Rods by Clark Hartzel

If you buy a fuel pump at a swap meet, don't forget that '60 and early '61 pumps have longer rods sticking out the bottom of the pump. The early pump number ending in 4704 sticks out about 7/16" while the newer pump number ending in 4886 sticks out about 3/16. Don't mix them up or you will have trouble.

I recommend an electric pump on all Corvairs as you can flip the switch and fill the carbs before cranking and it will clear a vapor lock. You can still use the mechanical pump for driving but the electric is a

great backup and makes the car start easier after sitting for long periods.

#### 77-83 Dodge B-150 Shock Absorbers by Clark Hartzel

I haven't tried this but rumor has it that '77 -83 Dodge B-150 van or pickup shock absorbers fit early Vairs and Greenbriers. If you go to a store and ask for Corvair shocks, they look at you like you are from some other planet!

Of course, I recommend you buy your shocks from a Corvair parts supplier to make sure they fit.




