### Chucky Rides Again!

At the sight of the sign for Telegraph Road off of I-696 he spit out a connecting rod. That's right, the con rod left its perch on the engine's crankshaft and landed in the block in such a way that the engine could still run albeit on just five cylinders. Somehow our hero Tom was able to nurse the car up to his residence only nine miles to the North. And then the "fun" started.



Chucky received a lot of attention from Tom and with help from the DACC Garage Squad. We did an engine swap at Tom's workplace over in Berkley. That was nice

'cause it was cold outside, and the building was heated. That engine wasn't quite up to snuff but in the interim Tom met a fellow McDonalds customer in the drive through lane. Unfortunately, she was going the wrong way and wasn't paying attention. Chucky took it on the chin, so some select-used metal bits were grafted to his right front corner. We didn't try to do a professional finish to the repair. Some would say this gave him "character". Several other repair sessions were needed to make Chucky reliable enough for Tom to enjoy some drive time. Meanwhile he was building up a proper later model 110 engine for installation. ### Valve Cover Racers - Part 2

Here we are in March and though July feels a long way off, we should get started on our valve cover racers. Normally, you would begin with a bare, clean valve cover. However, the pictures I'm using are for a previously completed valve cover racer, "Snoopy WW1 Flying Ace" that needed repairs. One of the ball bearing "fenders" broke loose and I needed to repair



it. The "fender" post was made using brass tubing with a bolt epoxied to the top and a flanged ball bearing epoxied at the bottom. In this case, the epoxy for the bolt didn't hold



and I had to repair it. Knowing the force that a valve cover

racer experiences at the stop, I used Loctite on the bolt threads. Unfortunately, I used red Loctite instead of blue and the bolt had to be cut out. After epoxying



a new bolt to the tube. the "fender" tube is ready for installation. Here is the fender assembly back together and ready to be installed.

The next photos show how the wheels are positioned and that the majority of the weight added is at the rear of the racer (Remember the tip on weight placement in Part 1). This racer does not use flanged bearings for the wheels, so the wheel was placed on washers as illustrated to center the bearing in the wheel and hot glue was used to secure the bearing.



If you use flanged bearings, they can be pushed up against the wheel and secured with super glue. Whatever ball bearings you use, the dust shields should be removed and the grease washed

out with solvent. Then lubricate the bearings with a little light oil. They will spin much better if you do this. As you can see, unwanted CDs or DVDs can make ideal wheels since they provide low rolling resistance. There is an issue with them, however, which will be covered in Part 3. The center hole in a CD or DVD is 15mm so you'll need a source for bearings with that outside diameter. I found some flanged bearings on eBay https://www.ebay.com/itm/371789716335 and I'm sure there are other sources as well. The center hole for the bearings I used was 6mm which is slightly smaller than a 5/8-16 bolt. Since I was using hardware already in my garage, I had to turn down a

portion of my bolts to fit the wheels. If you wish to skip that, metric hardware can be found in most hardware stores. Since the racer used in these illustrations was already built. You can see the method I used to locate the wheel axles. I used 1" aluminum square tubing with aluminum bar stock epoxied at each axle location for stability (No, I don't have stock in JB Weld, LOL).



to set, so you can move

things around a bit to put them exactly where you want. The bad news is that you have to wait 24 hours before doing any drilling or other machine work. If you are using unwanted CDs or DVDs, placing the axle centerline approximately 1/4" below the valve cover edge should give you just under 3" of clearance (Another tip from Part 1). Snoopy was my first attempt at building a valve cover racer. I felt he should have a companion, so I built "Ze Red Baron", his nemesis. As you can see from the pictures, I used a slightly different construction method. Instead of the tubing, I used 1 3/8" X 5/8" aluminum angle stock. Once again



aluminum bar stock was epoxied in place at the wheel

locations. The square tubing and angle stock was obtained locally (I think it was Menards, but I'm sure Home Depot, Lowes or even a local hardware store

would have something you could use). The bar stock (1" X 1/2") was purchased through eBay. Flanged ball bearings were used for the wheels on "Ze Red Baron", thus making it easier for them to roll without wobbling. Hopefully, you can see how that worked out from the pictures. Finally, one trick I tried was to mount a roller on ball bearings at the front of my valve cover racers. The idea was to help the racer move over the restraining bar on the track more easily and so get a better start. I'm not sure how effective that is, so I substituted a simple piece of aluminum sheet folded to help the racer ride over the end of the restraining bar on Snoopy. I left the roller on the Red Baron so I could compare how effective that was. As

you can see from the pictures, there were no wheels

how to prevent damage to the wheels while in transit in Part 3. Also, you will notice the difference in the supports between Snoopy and the Red Baron. Now that you've seen my techniques for building a valve cover racer, borrow some of my ideas or use your own ideas and get those racers built.

### TECH TIP by Jim Westervelt SECURE YOUR DECK LID

With batteries and spare tires becoming more expensive and therefore more prone to be "borrowed" from your Corvair, I have devised a simple method to secure the deck lid on late models. This will require a 7/32 drill, a 1/4-20 tap and a 1/4-20 x 1/2 inch cap screw. Start by removing the latch mechanism from the deck lid. Drill a 7/32 hole just to the right of the latch handle at an angle upward, as you would look at the latch mechanism from the rear of the car. There is just room between the handle and the lip of the latch body. Be sure to allow some room for the cap screw head. Now tap this hole at the same angle with the 1/4-20 tap. Reinstall the latch mechanism on the deck lid, and by using a T-handle allen wrench or a square drive universal tool, you may now install the cap screw in the tapped hole so that the latch mechanism cannot be operated. If a potential thief knows this trick also, he can simply remove the screw to get at your engine compartment, but I think most will be stopped. More later if I find how to secure the early models.

Please contact the members of your chapter to see how many of them would like to assist with the Concours at the 1980 Corsa National Convention in Marietta, Ga. this summer. The Concours Committee will soon be ready to mail the "Unit Judging System" training packets. There is a problem......We have only one volunteer so far. We are concerned that we will not have sufficient volunteers in time to carry out a training program. Conducting the training by mail is going to be a very time consuming process. This program must be underway by May 1, 1980. The call for judges will end at that time and the training packages will be mailed to the people who have been accepted as judge candidates. Naturally the concours must be planned around the number of judges that have been trained and not around the number of people who desire to enter.

The Corsa National Concours D'Elegance Rules, Revision 2, will be printed in the March Communique. Those rules will govern the Concours at the 1980 Convention. The actual judging will be performed in accordance with the Unit Judging Procedures developed by Roy Dieter and the San Diego group for use at the 1978 National Convention. These Procedures reduce the total amount of the vehicle that each judge must inspect. In fact, each judge will be looking at roughly 10% of the total vehicle. This "specialization" allows the judge to become very familiar with his part of the total judging effort. Training and expertise requirements are reduced substantially.

A special score sheet is provided for each judging unit which gives a detailed list of items to check and the point count for each item. Judging under these procedures will not require the kind of experience that is necessary when a judge must inspect the entire vehicle. The judges will not be required to make decisions concerning modifications or vehicle classification. They will inspect for quality and condition only.

Please use the fastest means at your disposal to get this urgent request to the members of your chapter. Ask them to respond directly to the Convention Concours Chairman, Lance Reddick, 3802 Edwards Terrace, Chattanooga, Tenn. 37412 with the following information. Name, Address, Telephone number, Judging experience if any, Restoration experience if any, Judging preference(early, late or FC) etc.

Point out to them that experience is not necessary as we are going to provide training. Ask that those who reply be reasonably sure that they are going to attend. For personal budget purposes, remind them to expect hi-test gas shortages and prices in the \$1.50 per gallon range by late July. Our motel rates will appear in the March issue of the Communique. Event rates and banquet prices will be in the April issue of the Communique. There will be  $\underline{\text{NO}}$  mail out of pre-registration packages for the 1980 Convention. All information will be in the Communique.

There will be one acre of flea market space under some big southern oak trees. We want to encourage all chapters to consider setting up a booth here. We further suggest that all flea market operators pre-price their merchandise. Contact the convention chairman to reserve your shady spot.
