Minutes of the Last Meeting

February 6, 2025

Josh got the regular meeting started around 7:00 PM following a short Board meeting. When the room was opened, Josh, Harry, and I were quickly joined by Chris, Joe, Don, Lane, Buck, Carl, Paul, Joe, Peter, and Gabe Lopez (Sterling Restorations). I hope I have included everyone.

This month the majority of the meeting was taken up by Club business. Specifically the 2025 Convention. Towards the end there was some Tech talk.

Treasury Report: The bank balance as reported in the last Newsletter was \$5290.72 Josh said he has received several dues payments (both checks and via PayPal) and will send this to Harry.

Membership: Josh did not report any new members this month.

Old Business: Josh said the inspection of Phil's car showed it to be structurally very good. No rust in the usual locations. Mechanically it has a 140 motor with a center-mount Holly 4-barrel carburetor. It starts and runs well. Josh has only driven it a short distance around Rosemore, brakes work fine. He thinks it might have a quick-shift setup but he wasn't sure. While on the lift, Don felt the rubber mounts for the sway bar needed to be replaced. The gas tank looked fairly new. The real concern is the interior The head-liner, carpet, and bucket seats need to be replaced. The back seat is not bad but does have small tears. It's questionable as to whether or not this needs to be replaced. However the package tray area does need work. The paint is good but might not meet Gabe's standards. Just needs to be cleaned up. Peter asked how it was

electrically? Josh said everything worked but the radio is out of the car and Josh will be checking it soon. Don said the front speakers are missing but easily replaced. Clark felt the door panels would clean up well rather than replacing them. Replacement door panels come plane. You have to transfer the emblems from the current panels. Herb said that we need to keep the price in the buyer's range. The car needs to look desirable and need not be perfect. Buck asked what the car would reasonably sell for as is and how much after it is fixed up. Josh thought, that since this is a desirable car ('66 Corsa 140, LA low numbers, no rust) it should bring \$5500-5800 as is. Whit the interior fixed, \$10k maybe more.

New Business: Josh received a solicitation from Central Coast Corsa (CCC) asking for financial assistance to offset the cost of the 2025 National Convention. The unexpected move from Santa Maria to San Luis Obispo will cause CCC and CORSA to dig deeper into their coffers. Harry asked if CORSA was currently expecting a short fall? Nobody knows yet as Registrations have just been opened. Buck inquired how much CCC was requesting? The note was not specific but listed \$500 as a "gold" doner amount. Josh said that CCRC was giving \$1500 although they have a healthier treasury. Other clubs were expected to kick in around \$500 also. Clark mentioned that there were a dozen or so Western clubs and an average of \$500 each should be sufficient. Josh also mentioned that CORSA would absorb some of the loss (if there were any). Clark said maybe we should be giving to CORSA as well? Various options were discussed. The donations can be directed towards a

specific event (like the Banquet or Autocross) if desired. In the end Don made the motion to donate \$500 to CCC for general use with the caveat that we could do more if necessary. Lane (and others) seconded this. By show of hands, and there were no objections, this was passed. Harry will send a completed donation form and a \$500 check to CCC.

2025 Convention: Josh and Clark reported that the Convention planning was progressing well. A last-minute change has moved the Autocross up to Thursday as there is maintenance scheduled at the air field for Friday. The Concourse will be Wednesday at the Elks Club a short distance away. The Car Show will be Tuesday evening. Parking assistance will be needed for Monday and Tuesday. Parking will not be controlled the rest of the week. Clark will work up a preliminary schedule to access where we are with volunteers.

At last report, all of the reserved rooms at the Embassy Suites had been taken. But CORSA was trying to secure another block of rooms. Regardless you can always try, as cancellations do occur. At this time ooms are available at the Best Western and the Springhill Suites, both a short walk away. Mention the 2025 CORSA Convention. Joe asked how pet friendly the hotels were? Josh said he would find out

Clark is in the process of working up a schedule for volunteer help with parking to access where we currently stand. The Convention will be here before we know it and we need to be prepared.

Convention Parking Volunteer Schedule Josh & Clark

SFBA will be handling the parking for the 2025 Convention. For Monday and Tuesday Corvairs that are entering the Car Show will be cordoned off in a special area of the hotel parking lot. There are two main ways to approach the Embassy Suites Hotel, and we will need 2 to 3 people to assist in guiding the Corvairs to the correct parking spot. It is expected we will need help from 8:00 AM to 8:00 PM on Monday May 19th, and from 8:00 AM to 6:00 PM on Tuesday, May 20. We have broken this down into 2 hour "slots" so as not to over burden anyone. But feel free to tackle multiple slots if you have the time and energy.

At the moment trailer parking is more of an unknown. We don't have an estimate of how many to expect. There will be an area set aside for trailers to unload and for parking, but this has not been finalized yet.

The time slots listed below are our best estimate of when cars will show up. During the busy times I expect we will need three people, four wouldn't hurt. Two to man the two main entrances and one to oversee the parking so the Corvairs don't get too close together and are parked neatly. Other times we should be able to get by with two.





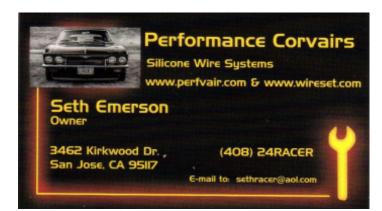
