Corvair Buried at Willow Run! by Eva McGuire

Here's a Willow Run secret I'm sharing for the first time: Did you know there's a 1962 Corvair buried on the grounds of the Willow Run Assembly Plant? Yes there is, and it's a complete car! How did it get there you ask?...

I was told by several former Willow Run auto workers that during the production years of making Corvairs, they took a 1962 Corvair and dug a big hole outside, lowered it in the hole, and set the car on fire. A fire pickup truck (like the one in this photo) was most likely used for this exercise.



They used the Corvair to help teach their firefighter/plant employees how to extinguish a vehicle on fire in case it occurred inside or outside around the plant. They would light the car up, put it out, and repeat the process. After they were finished with the exercise, they just filled up the hole with dirt and covered up the Corvair...where it remains to this day.

They also used to bury a lot of broken/scrapped engines, car parts, etc. I was even told that's "possibly" what they did with the engine that wouldn't start on the last day of production (May 14, 1969) that had to be replaced in 1969 Corvair car #5999 (which I doubt that story on this particular engine). Looks like I'm taking my metal detector and go engine and Corvair hunting (wink wink).

FUN FACTS: The Willow Run Plant was so large they had their own fire department which they called the "Fire Bri-

gade". They also had a medical facility with a nurse on staff, and their security department was called "Plant Protection."

When the Willow Run Corvair Plant was opened in 1959, it was the largest indoor plant facility in the world (occupying approx. 2.3 million square feet on 22 acres of land). It was considered one of the best state of the art facilities, and other car factories that were later built would use the Willow Run Plant as a model example of what their facilities should look like.

NO PHOTOS ALLOWED? At one point, the management at Willow Run (probably under the directive of a higher decision made at GM) allowed some Japanese automotive representatives to tour their facility and take photos in order to help them build their vehicle factories in a similar fashion. I know a lot of the auto workers shared with me that they weren't happy about that decision due to the foreign car competition during the 1970's/1980's.

Tensions were running high at that time. They even posted signs at their UAW meeting buildings that "No foreign cars were allowed" as only U.S. cars were welcome to park in their lot. (I still see signs like this posted). What makes this so interesting is that no photos were ever allowed to be taken inside the plant due to corporate secrets.

The only other time photos were allowed (outside of the Japanese car people) was when GM had their photographers take official photos for their archives or when someone inside the plant had an idea to improve something or another GM factory needed help with repairs or installation of certain assembly line machines, etc....

If it was an idea or repair, they would have to take a Polaroid photo and a manager/foreman would hand deliver it to the other plant so they could see what needed to be done. Once the suggested idea, repair or installation was completed, they had to destroy the photo so no evidence was left behind.

For those who aren't familiar with old photography...Polaroid cameras gave instant pictures without leaving a negative if

someone tried to make a copy photo to share with competitors. This ensured that GM's Willow Run Plant secrets remained protected.

That's why it's such a rare treat to find a photo of a Corvair inside any GM plant (outside of official events or GM photographs) as there aren't many. The photo of the Chevrolet fire pickup in this post (courtesy of GM) was one of the many emergency vehicles at GM's Willow Run Assembly Plant, Ypsilanti, Michigan (where the vast majority of Corvairs were produced). Note the name of "Chevrolet Fire Department - Willow Run."

Electric Fuel Pumps for Corvairs

At one of our meetings last year, Bob King described problems he encountered with repro Corvair fuel pumps, including incorrect shaft lengths, set screw holes that were never drilled, and poor diaphragm materials. Bob even called the manufacturers' engineers to give them an earful.

Bob's experience isn't unique. Posts written on the various online Corvair blogs are rife with similar complaints. Some owners report less than 500 miles on replacement fuel pumps before they fail.

Clark's Corvair Parts has also recognized the problem and will soon be introducing a new and improved mechanical fuel pump under their own brand. The external appearance (and inner workings) will be the same as the original A/C Delco units. According to their latest announcement, they feel confident enough to offer a 2-year guarantee. Stayed tuned.

Replacing the mechanical fuel pump altogether is a popular option for owners who've simply given up on the mechanical pumps.

There are so many types of electric fuel pumps on the market and a variety of ways to wire them up. Do-it-yourself Corvair owners have had to figure this out by themselves, but now there are three vendors who sell electric fuel pump kits: Clark's Corvair Parts, Ted Brown's "Brown Injection Systems, LLC" and Craig Nicol's "Racers Inc." Yes, in addition



to offering an improved mechanical fuel pump (coming soon), Clark's also offers and electric fuel pump kit.

Based on the literature, it appears that Mr. Brown's system has the advantage of mounting the pump inside the fuel tank where it is fully protected from damage, whereas Clark's and Mr. Nicol's setups call for mounting the pump on the undercarriage of the car.

On the other hand, Mr. Nicol's setup includes all the necessary wiring whereas Mr. Brown's includes wiring instructions but not the actual wiring. A wiring package is optional with the Clark's kit.

Shown below is a chart that compares the features of the three kits. The chart, which appears in the online Corvair Forum, was provided by Craig Nichol, so consider the source!

Irrespective of which one you choose, your installation should include two safety features: (1) a fuel pump cut-off switch in the event your engine loses oil pressure, and (2) an inertia switch that will turn off current to the fuel pump in the event your car is hit hard in a collision, especially from the rear. The last thing you need is the fuel pump to spray raw gasoline into the engine compartment due to a broken fuel line.

All of these electric fuel pump systems enable the pump to prime the carburetors without cranking the starter endlessly—a situation that arises when the car has been sitting for weeks and the carb bowls go dry. And all are less prone to vapor lock in comparison to the stock mechanical fuel pump.


