Valve Cover Racing Rules continued from pg 1.

If your racer meets all six, then it is legal according to the guidelines published on the CORSA website. Guidelines for Corvair Valve Cover Racing From the CORSA website, Revision 1 dated September 2023. CORSA provides the following guidelines as a convenience to event organizers and participants. Corvair Valve Cover Racing is similar in concept to the commonly known "Pinewood Derby," utilizing gravity-power racers competing in head-to-head eliminations on a two-lane track.

Racer Specifications:

1. Must have Corvair valve cover used in construction. The valve cover dimensions, height, length and width, shall be unaltered.
2. Wheels, 4 required, may be any diameter and use any axle and bearing combinations.
3. Gravity powered only, no motors, no springs, no magnets, no jet-propulsion, etc.
4. Maximum weight is 4.5 pounds, no minimum weight.
5. Maximum length 16" long, maximum width 8", including wheels.
6. No part of the racer to hang over the start gate, which is 3" in height.

NOTE: It is recommended that entrants make their racers with the wheels being the widest part of the racer.

Racetrack Specifications:

1. Track launch ramp to be 24 feet long, starting four feet high. Total length to be 40 feet.
2. Track to have sides and a center divider. Outside rails to be one inch high and the center divider to be 3/4" in height.
3. Starting gate area to be 16" in length.
4. Starting gate to be 3" in height.

Race Procedure:

1. Races will be run in eight-car heats. First eight cars checked in are first heat. second eight cars checked will be the second heat, and so on. Then main event will be the heat winners. If less than 32 cars entered then six-car heats.
2. No lane hopping, or interference with competition. First infraction re-run, second infraction disqualification. Which means one rerun for the entire event.
3. If judges rule a tie, then the cars will re-run that race until a winner is decided. In this situation, re-runs will be made in the opposite lane.
4. Must finish on wheels and in own lane. ■

[May 2025](#) Corvair of the Month

This is my 1960 Corvair 700 sedan. I have owned it for 48 years almost to the day.



We were living in Chicago at the time, and I saw an ad in a little newspaper for the car. The simple ad read something like; one-owner 30,000 miles \$500. No need for shrewd negotiations. The car was well worth the asking price.

Since the elderly lady owner never drove more than a mile or two at times the trip from Cicero to West Chicago (about 30 miles) was too much. My new prize arrived behind a tow truck. The cost for the tow off of the Eisenhower Expressway was \$20. Try doing that [today](#)! A new sock in the fuel tank sending unit and all was good again.

I have driven this car quite a bit in the last 40+ years. In 1977 we took it to a car show at the old Chicago Amphitheater. Won a 3rd place trophy so this is an award winning Corvair!



One of the pictures shows Patty and baby Paul in front of the car at the show. The next year we took the car to the same World of

Wheels show now at McCormick Place on the Lake also in Chicago. In the summer of 1979, we drove the car from Chicago to Southfield, Michigan for the 1979 CORSA National Convention. Saw the concours at the GM Tech Center but couldn't participate because we weren't CORSA members. I reminded that the next year but we drove Patty's black '64 Monza coupe down to Atlanta for the convention. Over the years we have added another 30k miles to the odometer of the '60 including a trip or two out to Vermont for the annual Cotrofeld Fall Color Tour.

A few years ago a terrible thing happened to the car. While idling in the driveway a carb leaked gas and the generator sparked a fire. The explosion blew off the (expensive) plexiglass deck lid but that was a blessing in disguise. Gary Kamora was parked next to the '60 and he quickly put the fire out. It was only a 45 second burn, but Hagerty deemed the car a total loss! I accepted a lower settlement but kept the car. A new (expensive) plexi deck lid and an El Cheapo Maaco paint job and the car is back on the road again. It lives in the garage at the other house but I think this season it will once again come out and play with the club.

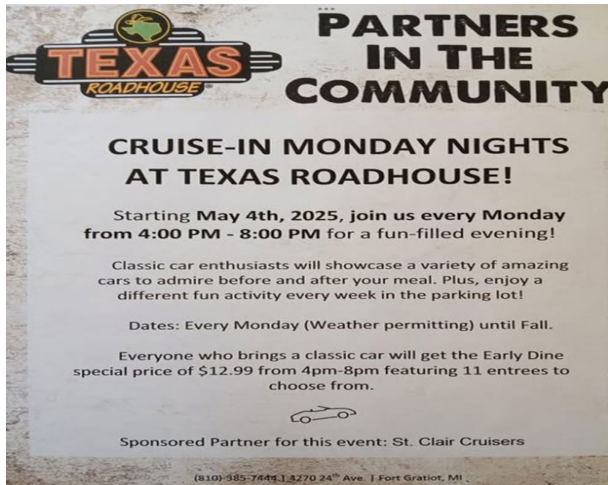

Transmission caused engine ping I recently bought a '65 convertible with Powerglide transmission. This car had a chronic engine ping which no amount of tuning seemed to cure. It would ping loudly at part throttle but stop when the gas pedal was fully depressed. The car was losing some transmission fluid which I assumed was just leaking out. After much thought I finally realized the connection between the two. Apparently the transmission modulator valve was defective and allowed the trans fluid to be sucked into the engine. This valve is a diaphragm type device that uses manifold vacuum from the engine to control the shift points of the transmission. If the diaphragm develops a hole, engine vacuum will suck the trans fluid into the engine causing it to smoke and ping. Replacing the modulator valve cured the problem.....

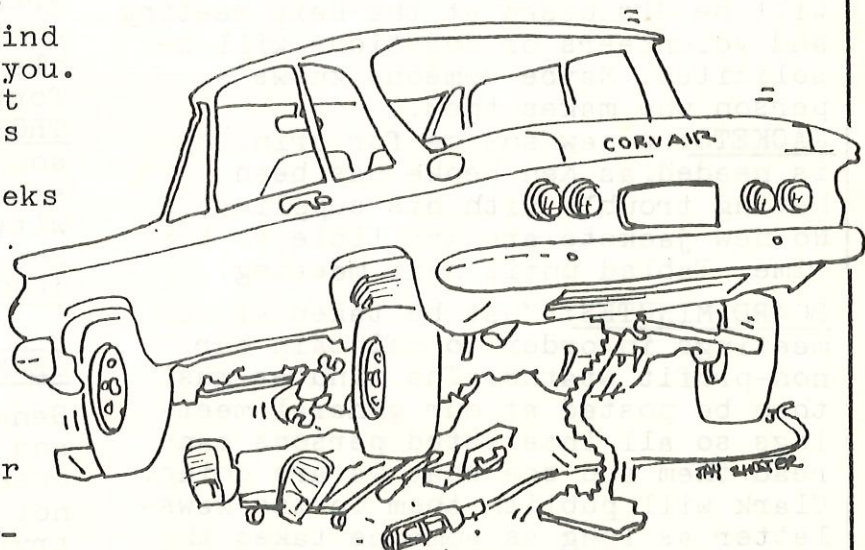

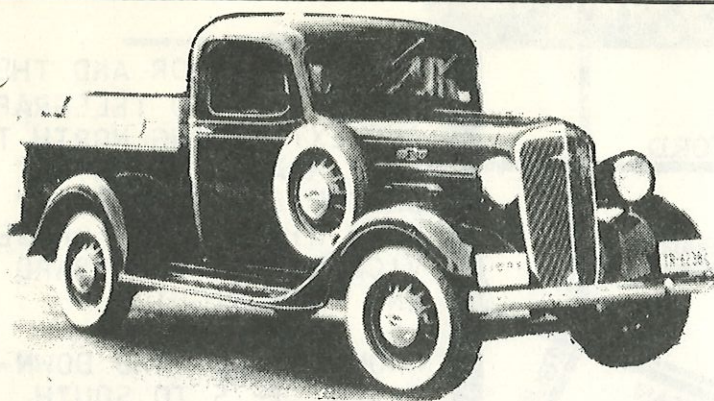

## Chevy Truck to Run in Great American Race

The Mockingbird Express, a restored 1936 Chevrolet pickup, has been entered in the 1985 Great American Race scheduled to run from June 24 to July 4.

According to LeRoi Tex Smith, director of public relations for the race, the owner of the truck, Joe Atkinson, said he expects to do well in the Los Angeles to New York City time/distance rally for pre-1937 vehicles.

"We couldn't have picked a more difficult vehicle to restore than the '36 Chevy truck," Atkinson said. "It seems that

every part we needed was special for the truck only." A traveling minister, Atkinson placed 21st in the 1984 race, just 14 minutes and 35 seconds off a perfect time for the 3,000 mile journey.

The race is restricted to 120 vehicles which must have been produced during the 1936 model year or before. The oldest vehicle entered so far is a 1909 Lozier by Tom Lester of Deerfield Beach, Fla.

As of mid-January there were over 75 vehicles in the race, and organizers expect the field to fill before the May 15 deadline.

The 1985 Great American Race will stop in 25 cities across the country according to an itinerary released by Great Race, Ltd. on March 25. The 120 entrants will come to Michigan as follows: Lansing, downtown, July 1 1:30-3:00 P.M. Detroit, Hilton Southfield, July 1, 3:00 P.M. till next morning. Toledo, OH, Portside area, July 2, 9:00-11:00 A.M.

In 1970, you could order your Ford in "Good Clean Fawn." Or, in '72, your Plymouth could be that stunning "Basin Street Blue."

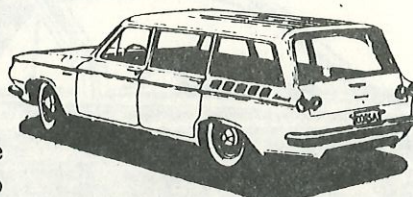

It looks like the year of 1970 will go down in history as the year that the ad men had their way. I wonder what ever became of "You're in the Pink?"

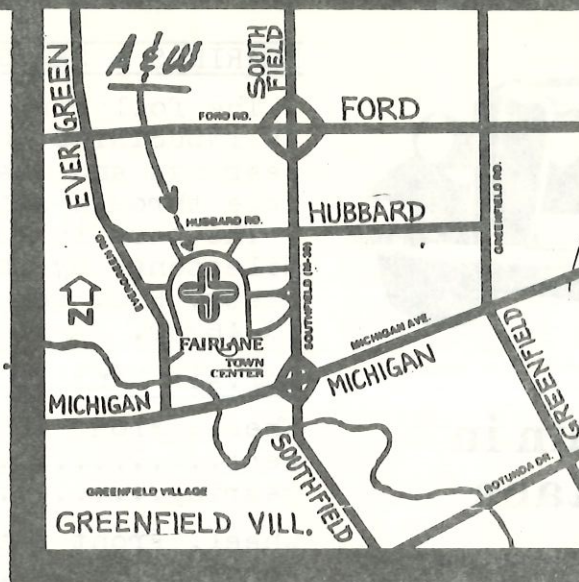

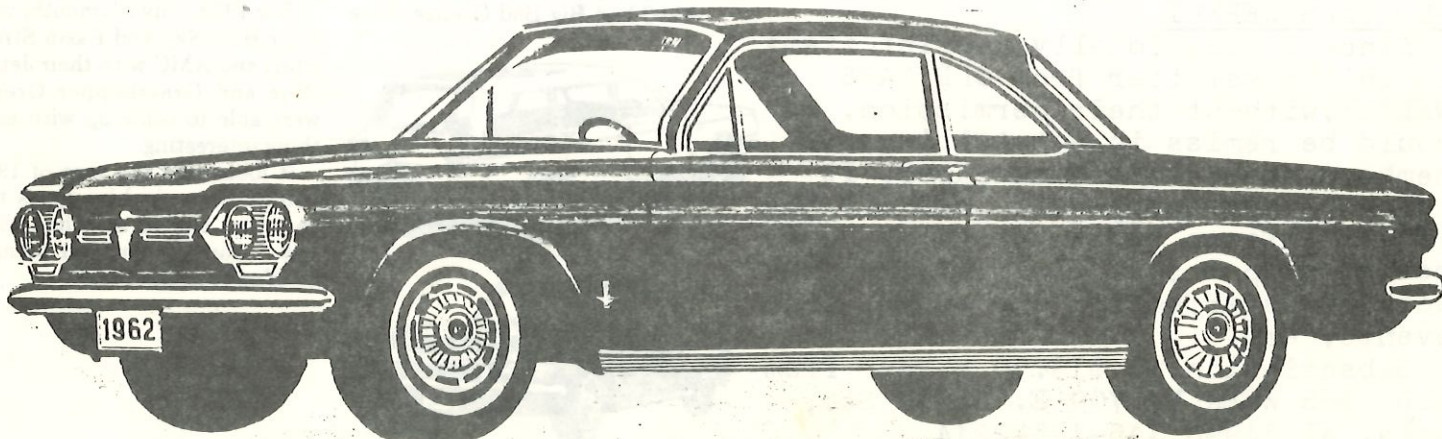
