THE PREVENTIVE MAINTENANCE SERIES

Note to Clark's Corvair Parts Regarding Torque Converter Seals (04/28/2025):

I am writing concerning an issue I observed with the torque converter seal (C1698).

Earlier this month I installed a reconditioned differential in a 1963 coupe, including flushing the converter, replacing the converter bushing and seal, and a complete refill with Amsoil synthetic fluid. The first highway test drive produced one drop of ATF out of the converter housing. Subsequent driving increased the leak until it leveled off at about 5 drops after each drive. This continued until I finally removed the drivetrain again and looked for a reason.

This is what I have concluded: The converter seal has a primary lip with a spring plus a secondary lip. As I understand it, a tiny amount of fluid escapes under the primary lip for lubrication and then is stopped at the secondary lip, as many other seals also do. Since petroleum lubricants contain multi-sized molecules, the primary lip stops all but the small molecules. When synthetic fluids are used and contain only small molecules, the amount of fluid leaking under the primary lip could be greater in volume and the secondary lip more significant in importance. With my converter on the bench I placed a new C1698 seal in an inverted position so I could examine the secondary lip and found it did not touch the hub. A second seal had exactly the same construction. I purchased a National 9845 seal and found that the secondary lip did seal at the hub. I re-assembled the car using the National seal with no leaks to date.

This may or may not be an issue with non-synthetic fluid but a warning might be in order to that effect. And a possible re-design of the seal might be a consideration.

Attached are pictures of the two different seals as I observed the fit of the secondary lip on the hub.


