Learning to Drive – A Family Saga

I'm sure we all have memories of ourselves learning to drive, as well as spouses, children, friends, and other families. My personal story was ordinary – watching my father drive for work and travel, high school drivers training... But, learning to drive wasn't always like that – especially for women of previous generations. My grandmother's battle to get a license was a somewhat amusing case in point.

She was born in 1900 in a very small rural area in North Texas, just south of the Oklahoma border. She probably never saw a car until she was in high school. Most travel back then was by mule drawn buggies, but about 1930 she and my grandfather borrowed a model T truck and moved their 4-year-old and 8-month-old daughters and the truck owner's son all the way to the Rio Grande Valley, over 650 miles away. The owner's son made the entire trip standing on the truck's running board.

My grandfather plowed the fields with a mule until he got a tractor, probably sometime in the 1940's, but he didn't get a car until about 1961. So of course, Grandma wanted to learn to drive. About that time, my immediate family drove from South Bend for a visit. One day, my dad drove my grandparents into town, where upon my grandmother asked to drive. My dad dutifully changed seats and grandma took the wheel. She had no feel for the throttle or braking and at the first turn she was flailing at the controls like a woman who went into a shoe store having a 75% off sale that ended in 15 minutes. At the next stop, my grandfather jumped out of the back seat and refused to get back in the car until my dad drove. My grandma took exception this and went into full termagant mode, but my dad quietly wiped the sweat off his face and agreed that was enough for the day. My grandfather insisted on stopping at church on the way home.

Eventually, she did get her driver's license – after failing the drivers test eight (yes, eight!) times. At the end of that last test, the DMV examiner told her, "Lady, you are the worst driver I've ever seen, but I'm giving you a license because I never want to risk my life getting in a car with you again."

A true part of my family's lore.

Air Power



This April, Audrey and I visited Windmill Island Gardens in Holland, Michigan. Besides 100,000 colorful tulips, they have the only authentic Dutch windmill (125 foot tall including the blades) in the US, relocated from Vinkel, Noord Brabant, the Netherlands in 1964. The De Zwaan ("the Swan") windmill was heavily damaged during World War II and had deteriorated almost beyond repair. Acquiring this windmill took three years of government negotiations followed by painstaking craftsmanship by Dutch millwright Jan Diederik Medendorp (pictured below) to supervise the disassembly, transport by ship, and restoration in Holland, Michigan as a working flour mill.



Jan and his wife Nellie arrived in Holland, Michigan on Oct 10, 1964, to supervise the windmill reconstruction. They became friends with Robert DeNooyer, a local Chevrolet dealer, who loaned them a **Corvair** to drive during their stay. I have been unable to find any details about this loaner Corvair – was it an early or late model (could have been either at that time), body style, color, manual or automatic? But I am sure they loved it, being "air powered." The most prominent use of

windmills in Holland was using air power to “get rid of water,” as the wind drove pumps to reclaim “below sea level” land for farming. Similarly, the Corvair fan “gets rid of water” by using air power to cool the engine (and heat the passengers)!



Before this analogy goes too far, I must toss a fan belt to drive a water pump. As a thank you, DeNooyer shipped a **Malibu convertible** overseas to Medendorp after his return to the Netherlands. Was this change of wind due to styling, Ralph Nader, or a big V8? In return, Jan made a 1/10 scale replica windmill called De Zwaantje (“the Little Swan”) which he gave to DeNooyer who later donated it to Windmill Island Gardens. The plaque on the Little Swan (pictured below) is how I learned about their loaner Corvair.

Ramblings from your Humble Editor—

Changes to CCE Alert SMS Messages: The CCE Alert System has had the ability to send email alerts and SMS text messages to members who signed up for these services. The email alerts are not affected. These are messages sent as emails to members to alert them to last minute notices that have not been placed in the *Airhorn*. These show up in CCE member’s email inboxes, like all other email messages. There also has been the capability to send SMS text messages directly to member’s mobile devices, for those members who do not always check their emails on a timely basis. When members sign up for CCE Alerts in SMS text message format, they are asked for the names of their mobile device service provider. This was requested because each mobile device provider has a different server address for sending text messages to its customers and the operator of the CCE Alert system must route messages to different servers, depending on the mobile device provider the CCE member uses. For some reason, a number of mobile device service providers are discontinuing the service of sending SMS text messages to their customers in the form of email messages. Some providers, T-Mobile and Verizon for example, simply drop the SMS text message request. The sender, the CCE Alert system, has no idea the message will not go thru. For now, AT&T is sending a nasty-gram message back to the CCE Alert system that its email to SMS message service will be discontinued as of some certain date. CCE members who signed up for SMS text CCE Alert messages should be aware that they may not be getting CCE Alert system messages on a timely basis or not at all. Research is currently underway to find a solution to this situation that does not involve paying for some third party service to continue to send SMS text messages from the CCE Alert system.

CCE Spring Tour 2025

I'd like to begin this article by thanking Lin Parro for all the work she does as Activities Coordinator in putting together a Spring and Fall Tour every year. As the years pass, it becomes more and more challenging to come up with new destinations of interest, as CCE has seen just about every car related attraction in the area. It's also because we've been doing tours for more years than I can remember. That's why you'll hear Lin asking for ideas at the General Meetings.

The idea for last year's fall tour to the Wisconsin Automotive Museum in Hartford was suggested by Ted and Pat Malo. Thanks again Ted and Pat! This year, John DiProva and Jane Horak said that they'd really like to go down to Springfield to see the National Corvair Museum.

So, on May 4th, 19 CCE members met up at the BP Station in Channahon (with three others joining us en route) for the 2025 Spring Tour. Since the weather couldn't make up its mind if it really wanted to rain or not, only five Corvairs made an appearance.

Our driving excursion also included a section of iconic Route 66 with historic Atlanta as our first stop. There we enjoyed lunch at the Country-Aire Restaurant, where we were introduced to Lumi, the Pie Lady, the first of four "Muffler Man/Bunyan Giant" statues we'd see in Atlanta. After lunch, we drove into downtown Atlanta to the American Giants Museum, which houses a rotating collection of International Fiberglass giants. The museum tells the story of the kitschy and quirky "giant" statues that sprang up in the 1960s as advertising gimmicks across the United States. Other sites of interest in town include seven building murals, several museums and historic sites, the only octagonal library in Illinois, and more.

Our next stop was the National Corvair Museum where we were greeted by Brian Nicholson, the Curator (and Prairie Capital Corvair member), who provided us with a guided tour. Larry and Shelly Claypool were also there and were able to provide additional insight into the cars on display.

From the museum, we headed to Route 66 Motorheads Bar and Grill, Museum and Entertainment Complex for a bite to eat and a beverage or two. You have to actually see Motorheads

for yourself in order to be able to describe it. In the most basic of terms, it can be said that it has a most unique and widely varied display of car related and Route 66 memorabilia. For example, there is a rear end of a '65 Corvair (complete with the tail lights lit up) hung above the entrance to the restrooms.
