Minutes of the Last Meeting

July 3, 2025

Josh got the regular meeting started around 7:02 PM following a short Board meeting. When the room was opened, Josh, Harry, and I were quickly joined by Peter, Seth, Don, Jim, Vince, and Jeffrey. I hope I included everyone.

Treasury Report: Harry reported that he will be stepping down as Club Treasurer and VP. He is in the process of down-sizing and family obligations are taking precedence. The bank balance, as reported in the last newsletter, was \$3,590.53.

Membership: Josh reported that we had two new members. A lady from Livermore and someone from Mountain View. I didn't catch the names, but Welcome!

Old Business: Nothing reported.

New Business: Josh showed the Club's new web site. At the bottom there is a "Latest..." section where he posts items that didn't make it into the newsletter. This is still in progress.

2025 Convention: Jim and Vince reported that the 2025 Convention was a huge success. They actually made a profit! The large number of last minute walk-ins tipped the scales. CORSA was not prepared for the large number of late arrivals and ran out of Program Guides and Banquet tickets. Jim thought because the Convention was prior to school letting out, many didn't know until the last minute if they could attend. But this is a good problem to have! Jim said people came from all over the world, including Germany, Austria, Switzerland, Canada, and of course Australia. Jim said, in the end

the Radisson did us a big favor. San Luis Obispo was a much better venue than Santa Maria. Clark said he was hesitant because he was used to a one day event (like Vairfest). "What am I going to do for a full week?" But he thourghly enjoyed himself! Josh said this puts to bead the idea "you can't hold a convention in California, it's too expensive and no one will come".

In the Autocross, notably Christy got 6th in his Ultravan! In the Concource Bruce got Silver for his Yenko, Jeffrey got Bronza for his '61 Raffle car, Hal got Silver for his Rampside (missed Gold by less than a point), Jim said he missed Bronza by .02 pts for his '64 Cvrt.

CORSA sent out an evaluation form to all that attended asking for their feedback. Typically people don't respond unless they have complaints, but in this case the overwhelming response was positive. Especially for the host hotel (Embassy Suites). The large atrium area made it convenient to sit and talk with others as you were taking a break from the scheduled events. Not to mention the end of day happy hour. The concourse location at the near by Elks Club was also well received. Surprisingly, at least to me, the Autocross was very well attended. Having to put up with the TSA requirements was not a big deal. And the Corvette Club, which was in charge of timing the event, did a superb job. All in all about the only complaint was the wind although this did manage to keep everyone cool. Some were disappointed in the lack of having more vendors but there is not much CORSA can do about this.

Minutes...

Josh said the newest issue of Hagerty's Drivers Club featured Bruce's Yenko Stinger

Pete said he put new wheels and tires on his '65 Corsa. He put on 14" Rally Wheels and BF Goodrigh tires (235-60 on the rear and 215-60 on the front). Pete went to Andy's Tires in South SF). Vince said with 13" wheels you don't have many choices. Josh said Max's is back in production (they stopped for a while) and Coker makes some (very expensive)

After getting the new tires, Pete didn't make it a mile before his clutch cable broke and he had to be towed home. Don said when you replace the cable, also check the plastic pulleys, replace with Aluminum if cracked or broken. Clark's has them. Check the Tech Guides for installations tips. Don said this job is easy to do if you have a lift!

Jim said, according to Ray Segman, the wire being used today is too brittle. Paul said he bought one from Roger Parent that is very high quality. Not sure if these are still available.

Jeffrey said he had a 110 throttle linkage from Roger Parent that he does not need. It's still in the plastic. He is moving on to a 140 motor.

Jim asked what lube should be used when assembling rubber parts? He is replacing the rubber mounts on the sway bar and finds the new rubber parts to be very tight. Seth said to find something that doesn't attack rubber. Like silicon lube. But use just enough to get the parts assembled, you want them to stay in place once assembled. Seth that tire shops use something when mounting tires, maybe you can

get a bit from them? Also check the Tech Guides. Jim also asked if you could use a '69 clutch cable on '65 to '68 Corvairs? Seth said "yes". What he has done is fold back the stamped piece and bolted the cable at the bottom part of the U shaped bracket using a short bolt and washers.

Swap & Sell: Nothing specifically mentioned.

Meeting adjourned about 8:23 PM.





Quarry Lakes Park Maps





Our Annual SFBA/Valley Picnic will be at Quarry Lakes Park in Fremont. If you haven't been there before this is a very nice park with plenty of green grass and lakes for fishing. swimming, etc. See the park's web site for current Covid restrictions. The city does charge a bit to drive into the park (about \$5 a car; a bit more for dogs) and swimming is also a little extra. If you choose, you can park outside the park and walk in. We won't be far from the entrance kiosk. There is plenty to do there for both kids and adults. Lots of hiking trails around the lakes. I will get there a bit early and try to reserve a suitable spot on the North side (see maps below). The BBQ should be ready to go by noon. The Club will provide the basics (burgers, dogs) so just bring a side dish to share (a salad of some sort, munchies, a dessert, sodas, or whatever) and your appetite. Help in managing the BBQs is always appreciated. This is usually a sunny park so sun screen and hats may be in order (we will try for a shady spot but no quarantees).

Getting There:

From I-80 in Fremont, take the Decoto Road (Hwy 84) exit East. Turn left on Paseo Padre Parkway, then right on Isherwood Way. Proceed to the park enterence on the right.

From Mission Blvd (Hwy 238) in Fremont, turn South on Nursery Ave. (away from the hills) and right (West) on Niles Blvd. Turn left on Osprey Drive and left on Quarry Lakes Drive. Proceed to the park enterence on the left.



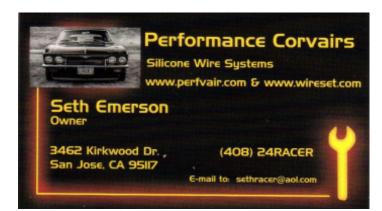
