The only one that is ready to run is my 1963 Monza 4-door sedan. We call it "The Zabriskie Monza" since I bought it from the Zabriskie family back in New Jersey. Aunt Jessie Zabriskie was the only other driver of the car. Since acquiring the car from Red Zabriskie, Jr. (Jessie's nephew) we have run the mileage up from 16,5xx to just over 20,000. The car is about 98% original as built by the UAW boys over at the Willow Run plant back in April of 1963. It is certified by the AACA as a Historic Preservation of Original Features - one of very few Corvairs with such a distinction. It even has the original non-viton pushrod tube o-rings and yes, they are currently leaking!

I have some other Corvairs and projects in the works. Just recently I was able to buy the 1962 Monza convertible that Bill Johnson owned before his passing. Another early convertible project is the 1963 Spyder that I bought from Sue Hamil. Her husband, Rex, was doing a complete restoration of the car and I hope to finish it this year and get it back on the road. Just a few days ago as I write this Ian Smith and I have returned from Southern Ohio with a 1961 Lakewood. I have some plans to spiff it up a bit and then see where the hobby takes that one. And for you late model guys and gals there is a 1965 Monza convertible in the Caveman Garage awaiting a solution to low compression in an engine that was supposedly "rebuilt" by the previous owner. Hoping that by the time you read this the problem was solved and the '65 is out killin' bugs again.

So, there is the first installment of a loooong story. Hope you enjoy following along. Also hoping this story has a few new chapters down the road. ■



- With lead pencil scrib outline of existing lid latch on lid 2. and lower striker on body.
- Remove two bolts holding lid latch and discard. 3.
- 4. Remove 2 bolts holding lower striker.
- Using striker bolts, install key lock assembly between engine 5. lid and latch assembly.
- Align latch and lock assembly as close as possible to outline 6. scribed in step #2 and tighten bolts securly.
- Using Allen Head Bolts, reinstall lower striker and adjust it 7. about 1/8" lower (the thickness of Keyed Lock Assembly). Align to outline scribed in step #2.
- Close lid and check Latch and Lock Operation, align and adjust 8. as needed.
- After all needed adjustment's are done install 2 Jam Lock Nuts 9. (supplied) on lower striker bolts from the inside of Engine com partment. Farts:


