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

She lived in Long Corner her entire life but for a short period in Georgia and Arizona when her husband was in the U.S. Army and the last three years in Frederick.

She was born November 3, 1930, to Harry William Pickett and Florrie Mullinix Pickett. She was the last of her immediate family, having three brothers, W. Donald Pickett, J. Ernest Pickett and Marshall E. Pickett who predeceased her. She is survived by her husband, Wilbert K. Utz; her sons Les Utz, New Market;



and Curtis A. Utz and his wife Ruth of Scaggsville. She is also survived by five grand-children, Jessica Romano, Ashley DeVries, Caroline Utz, Dylan Utz, and Lillian Utz, and one great-grandchild, Sophia Black.

Member Spotlight: Mike Coraggio and his Replica Yenko Stinger!

Planes, cars, motorcycles, trains, I've always loved them all. As a kid, I read every book and magazine about them that I could get my hands on. I began modeling when I was about five, primarily building and painting cars and planes.

When I bought my first motorcycle, I was hooked on wheels. I rode every chance I could, mainly long distances on the back roads. I treasured every minute of being one with the road.



Over the years, I collected what my wife began calling my "stable" of classic bikes. I discovered each bike's uniqueness: British, Italian, American, German, and Japanese. I "exercised" a different one every clear day—I loved riding and working on them and became a real wrench twirler. Building a 1977 BMW R100S from scratch was one of my most memorable experiences. My garage is my inner sanctum. It was a real bummer when life intervened, and medical issues caused me to stop motorcycle riding after 43 years. That's when my wife, yes, my wife, suggested I turn my attention to and apply my mechanical experience to classic cars. The hunt for the perfect vehicle began.

My dad had a 1962 Corvair four-door in metallic gold. I thought getting a Corvair would give me a connection with him. Also, since there was a local Corvair club, I would have access to guys with knowledge and experience with Corvairs.

I read and researched everything—cars, the market, prices, buying and selling, car shows, auctions, clubs, people, etc. Talking to the experts near and far was an incredible trek through the classic car world. That's how I met local Corvair guru Richard Kaetzel.

I found a 1968 Monza coupe restored as a Yenko Stinger replica in Pennsylvania. Richard Kaetzel helped me a lot getting the car down here and sorting it out. The brakes needed to be rebuilt, and the engine made a terrible, rattling noise.

I took it to the Corvair Ranch, and they found a washer had been dropped down the carburetor and worked its way into a cylinder. It bounced around, causing severe damage to the cylinder walls and the piston face. Fortunately, since the engine jugs are separate, only one had to be replaced. The bores were opened to a larger diameter.

Brett rebuilt the engine to race specs with four single-barrel carbs and a hotter cam. The car tended to diesel, so I asked Levi to install a Crane electronic ignition. He set the timing to 16° BTDC and recommended using the highest octane fuel (93) and mixing in some racing fuel.

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The car no longer diesels and runs noticeably smoother and quieter. Since I don't drive the vehicle frequently, I feel all this is a trade-off for the higher fuel price.

The interior needed a little work. I replaced the tiny, aftermarket chainline steering wheel with a stock Corvair model, installed carpeting in the trunk, and replaced the seats with the more comfortable bucket variety. Levi and I installed shoulder seat belts.
