Treasury Report: Harry is still filling in as Club Treasurer until a replacement steps up. The bank balance, as reported in the last newsletter, was \$3,211.98.

Membership: Josh reported 4 new members Jim Pennell from Arroyo Grande, Laura C, Gregory D, and Rodney E from San Francisco and Vince from Central Coast Corsa.

Old Business: Josh mentioned that the Club was still looking for a Club Treasurer and V.P. to take over for Harry. The VP's job is to fill in when pre

New Business: As Josh was talking about the open Club positions, Peter Tachis stepped up and volunteered to be Club VP. Thanks a lot, this helps enormously.

Events: Corvair Cockpit Day at the Oakland Aviation Museum was well attended. Lane reported the Corvairs garnered lots of attention.

Gabe's Open House was a fun event. Clark reported there were 20 or 25 in attendance and half were SFBA members. Herb drove his '64 Convertible and said he really enjoyed the day. This year Bruce and Eric couldn't make it. Bruce was not feeling well and Eric had just moved to Idaho This year the event was scheduled at the last minute as it was difficult to find a suitable time. Gabe is very busy right now.

The Vault event has officially been scrubbed for this year. It was becoming impossible to find a suitable weekend. Next year we have to start our planning earlier.

Don't forget the Fan Belt Toss is coming up Oct 24-26th. This will be at a new location this year.

The next VairFest is scheduled for June 27, 2026 at Heritage Park in Arroyo Grande again.

2027 CORSA Convention: Josh said the 2027 Convention will be just outside Nashville, TN. Probably in May. CORSA saw how well the last Convention went and it had an earlier than usual start. May is better than July in Nashville.

Phil's '66 Corsa: Don couldn't make it this evening but he had sent pictures of the recovered front bucket seats. Johnny did an outstanding job! Last month Don reported that one of the rear windows was hard to roll down, it appeared to be binding on something. This was fixed, Don found an adjustment point to correct the out of aligned tracks. Next up on the agenda is to recover the top off the rear seat (the bottom was recovered a few months ago), install the new carpets,

and get the radio installed. Josh has checked the radio and it works perfectly. Maybe Phill had it rebuilt. Lastly we need to go through the brakes and suspension which look good but still need to be checked.

Josh said as he was driving home from the SFBA/Valley Picnic in August, huis Corvair started to run VERY rough. It had been running very well too. He pulled over and figured it had to be something simple. After careful inspection he noticed the rubber cross-over tube was split. A massive vacuum leak. He was able to fashion a tourniquet out of an old Latex glove and this worked well enough to get him to an auto parts store. There he purchased some rubber tubing. This worked well enough to get him home where he could fashion a more permanent solution. Josh said it just goes to show even when your Corvair is running great, things can change in a hurry.

Herb said years ago he was driving home from work (San Ramon to San Pablo) when his generator went out. And it was raining. He continued to drive just hoping to make it home. He said just as he was pulling in the engine quit but he was able to coast into the





garage. Josh said he must have had a Corvair Angle on his shoulder! Herb explained that his Zoom background—a picture of his Corvair— is actually a painting by his father. Beautiful work!



Herb asked what brand of radio was in Phill's car. Josh said it was an original AC Delco AM/FM radio. Herb wants to replace his radio with a better one. Lane said nowadays there are many Blue Tooth replacements that work through the phone. Ray and Laura both said that's what they do. Seth said that since Herb's Corvair is an early model, the radio is easy to replace. On late model Corvairs it's much harder to get the angles pieces to fit correctly in the dash.

Herb said he has been an SFBA member for 45+ years and ever since we started having Zoom meetings, he thinks the meetings are the best they ever have been.

Vince reminded us that this meeting was being held on the 66th Anniversary of the Corvair. It came out on October 2nd, 1959.

Laura said she bought her Corvair from someone in Florida and had it trucked to San Francisco. She said the transporter was awesome. But shortly after driving it a bit, the emergency brake went out. This is vital in SF for an automatic trans which has no Park! She took it to Zack's and had it replaced. Because the car had been sitting for some time, she went ahead and had the oil changed. But after bringing it

home she notices oil leaks. She thinks it's differential fluid. Strange as it was fine prior to the oil change. She mentioned that she finally got her original Yellow CA plates approved by the state.

Laura ask where she could get car aligned? Lane said he took his to Hayward Alignment. He thought they did a very good job. The people there said they liked working on the older cars. Peter said he took his to Dito's in South SF on Mission

Peter said he is having a high temp issue with his Corvair. It's been this way since he has owned it. He just noticed one of the fan blades was broken. Could that be the cause? Vince said that is probably not the cause, but it needs to be fixed as it will cause a lot of vibration. Josh said he had an extra fan that Peter could have (one of the benefits of joining SFBA!). Seth agreed that a broken fan blade may not be the cause, but find out where the fan piece ended up. This may be blocking enough air to cause the engine to overheat. Lane asked if Peter has had the exhaust temp checked. Peter said no he hadn't. Lane said the CA fuel blend may cause the engine to run leaner and thus hotter. Lane suggested upping the main jet size, he uses #53 on the primaries.

Peter asked if anyone had tried the new carburetors Clark's is now selling. Lane said he saw the castings at the Convention in San Luis Obispo, and they looked very good. Seth said the parts are not out yet. Josh said maybe Clark's is having supply chain or tariff issues. That's what happened with the fuel pumps. Lane said it may be because of the top carburetor sections. Peter asked if there were alternatives available. Josh said with Peter's 140, central

mounted Holly is a good choice. Like a Holly 390. Seth said a 350 to 400 CFM carburetor would be sufficient for the Corvair engine. Josh said he could also go with fuel injection. There are several outfits that convert systems for other cars to the Corvair. Rather than monitoring the engine coolant, they adjust the systems to head temperature. Josh said Cameron took his Corvair to Zaky's in SF because it was running hot. Zacky installed larger jets and Cameron thinks this really woke the car up. Josh said he thinks Zacky installed #53 main jets. Seth mentioned that on the 140s, the stock jets were #48 for the secondaries and #50 for the primaries. Josh said that Cameron also used Lucas Octane Booster which may help with the CA gas.

Lane is rebuilding his 140 engine after dropping a valve seat. He has installed new pistons and rings. He had the head checked by Tennyson Machine Shop in Hayward and everything looked ok. He hopes to be finished in a week or two. But the engine is tired. He has another he is also working on. Lane asked if Seth had modified any carburetors to put the jets on the side and was it worth it. Seth said "yes" but only for racing.

Seth asked how many were going to Palm Springs for the Fan Belt Toss. Vince, Lane, and Peter were going. Josh said Eric would be going as well as Paulo with his new trick engine. Vince said at the last FBT meeting, several clubs would be helping out. It will be like a mini-convention. This year everything will be in one place. Matt's Off-Road Recovery will be the guest of honor. Check out their web site, they

use a "slightly" modified Corvair wagon as one of their towing vehicles.

Last year a '61 Corvair got over 200 HP. Peter said he would like to get to that level also. Well this is the place to find out how! Josh said he would put him in contact with Val. Laura asked who

would be driving their Corvairs? Seth said "no", as he has to take the truck to haul all of his parts for sale. Vince said that it was too far to drive a 60 year old car without A/C. Lane will be towing his.

Seth mentioned that the CORSA Officers Election is now open and we should all vote. For our division (West Coast), Scott Howey (Flat Six Graphics) is running for Director. Right now he is unopposed but votes still matter. This shows CORSA how vibrant and active the Western Division is. Seth said the Eastern Division race would be interesting as there are several candidates. Vince encouraged everyone to at least join CORSA. Without their help there

would be no National Conventions. Seth said the Communique each month lists new members. Following the last Convention there was a huge spike in memberships, hope they stick around.

Meeting adjourned about 8:10 PM.

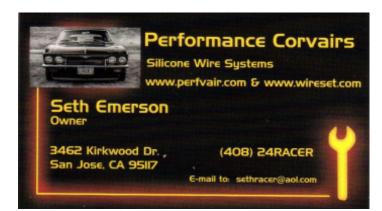
