## 7. TECH TIPS:

## Matching Keys and Locks

by Craig Nicol Corvair Technical Guide, Volume 4, First Edition Body Page 45

As manufactured, an early (1960-64) Corvair used one key for all the locks, though over time as the locks are replaced this characteristics is sometimes lost. It isn't difficult to get back to "one Key" operation. You could conceivable code all the locks on all of your 1960-66 Corvairs so that they all operate with the same key. While that sounds convenient, it might pose a problem if you should ever sell one--the new owner might get greedy! You can take the mismatched lock to any locksmith or you can code the locks yourself; the only difficult part is getting the stainless steel caps off and back onto the locks. From 1946 to '66 all GM cars used the same groove pattern on the side of the key, so any lock in that range can be coded the same as another. The hex-head and round-head keys that are so familiar are only cosmetically different. 1967-69 Corvairs use locks with different side-groove patterns on the keys and these models used six different side-groove patterns in the three model years. Since the keys used in '67-69

model years won't fit in the other locks, the trunk/glove lock can't be easily keyed to the same codes as the door/ignition locks. If there's enough interest, perhaps we could publish an article about coding locks in a future issue of the Communique`. (7/05)
