Membership: Josh reported that we had one new member this month, Scott Lyon from Pleasanton. Welcome!

Old Business: Nothing specifically mentioned.

New Business: Josh said it was suggested that SFBA start up its own Forum on the web site. Josh looked into this and the cost would be around \$12/month. Sterling Restorations Welding 101 Buck & Paul

Hi Clark, The welding class was really well done. Gabe went through the safety procedures and then the steps to cut out bad panel segments, cut out a patch, then MIG tack the patch back into the cutout. He had some bad doors that they could not use for a resto job and those were the ones we practiced on. Everybody - about 9 of us - got the opportunity to do all the steps. It showed my why bodywork is so expensive. Its very critical once you cut out the bad piece to match the patch as closely as possible, and make sure you have no sharp corners at the edges because the path will quickly melt, The gap needs to be 1/32 0r 1/16th gap all around so you don't have to use much filler. The piece I cut out of the door was actually a sandwich of bad material, the first layer was the original sheet metal, then bondo, then a second layer of metal (a patch piece) and more bondo, so I had to enlarge the hole in order to get to some decent material of the original door. Once cutting out and fitting the patch material, using small magnets to fix it in place, as the patch was on the main door surface, start tacking, only do one tack then move opposite for the second, then space the next tack away from the first one, going very slowly not to overheat the original door. Then you have to go back and tack adjacent to the first tacks to fill in the gap. I went too fast and had a bit of a warp when done. Then grind down the tacks to match the original surface with three different grits, this being the really careful step, so as not to damage the original panel surface. I learned the basics and that there is no way i'm going into the body business. Really takes a lot of skill and TIME! No wonder it costs what it does. - **Buck Jones**

Hi Clark, The welding class was great! It focused solely on MIG welding with automotive gauge sheet metal, exactly the skills needed for our cars. Most of the class time was hands-on experience. Gabe had a couple vintage truck doors on stands for everyone to practice filling holes, cutting out rust and making patch panels, grinding/sanding welds, etc., so the students could practice while Gabe gave tips on improving their welds. - **Paul Beers**



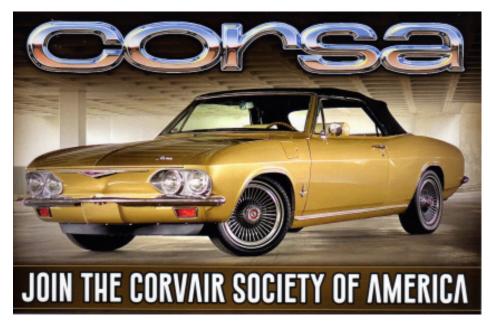

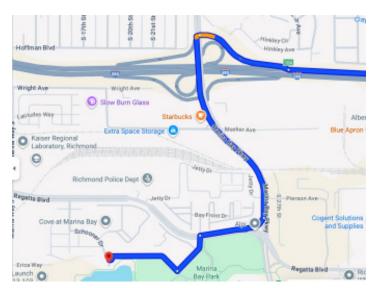

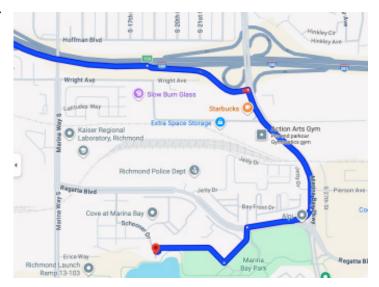

coupe from Chris Shade (sp?) in Nebraska in June. He had it shipped out here. This is a Marina Blue, 110 4-speed.



He has put about 1000 miles on it so far and now the clutch is slipping. He took the car to Lane's house in Castro Valley, and they worked on some adjustments. It's better but still slips so it needs to be replaced. Scott asked if the disk can be replaced without taking out the whole engine and trans? Unfortunately, the answer is "no". However, removing the engine is not that daunting a task. It seems the hardest part is getting the rubber seal attached when the engine is reinstalled. Scott also notices a minor squeal from the blower bearing. He purchased a replacement from Clark's but was wondering if the bearing can be repacked with grease. Josh said he has tool for doing that and it worked for him. He will send it to Scott so he can try it. To use the bearing that Scott did buy, he will have to press out the old bearing and press in the new. He asked if he would have to remove both carbs? Seth said he can do it with only one carb removed but it might be difficult to measure the bearing height. This has to be installed such that the fan barely misses the top shroud.

Seth suggested Scott obtain a copy of "Corvair Basics", this comes with a membership to CORSA which he should also definitely join, and also "How to Keep Your Corvair Alive". These books cover the basics for new Corvair owners that intend to work

on their cars themselves and don't have access to a complete shop.

Scott asked if the Club had any QR codes that can be displayed to let others conveniently access the Club's web site. Josh said we use to, but these have not been updated. It's a good idea and he will check into it. Maybe two sided to share with Valley Corsa. Scott said he took his Corvair to Good Guys in Pleasanton and was parked between some nice Corvettes. He got more attention than the \$80k neighbors!

Carl said that his engine, that he had taken to a mechanic to rebuild, was still sitting there. It has become apparent that this shop will not get to it any time soon. He has decided to take the engine to another place that specializes in Porche and VW engines. They are familiar with Corvairs but haven't worked on them. As soon as the heads come off, Carl thinks he will know the cause of the problems. Carl talked (emailed?) with Larry Claypool about his engine noise and Larry thought it might be a small item, like a washer, that has gotten into a cylinder. Carl has planned on a complete rebuild and asked about replacing the crank. Lane said he wouldn't replace the crank unless it was absolutely necessary. Because it's a 110 engine and the crank is not nitrided, the journals can be ground a few mills without losing hardness if needed. Lane and Peter felt the original parts were made better than today's replacements. Carl thinks that by looking at the car's condition, the engine has 133k miles on it (not just the 33k miles on the odometer). Seth said the "water shed" moment while working on a Corvair motor is when the block gets split. Before this, it's a regular engine (lifters, valves, rings, pistons, etc.) but splitting the block brings a lot more things into play.

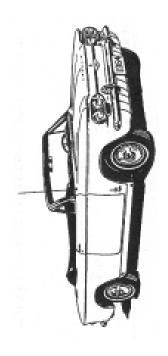
Jeffrey said in his neighborhood they have an Eichler Home Tour and the organizers wanted him to park his '67 Corvair our front as a "period" piece. Jeffrey was wondering for "Modernism Week", the week before the Fan Belt Toss in Palm Springs, the organizers could arrange for some to bring their Corvairs out early for the publicity. Josh will bring this up with CORSA as it applies with Conventions also.

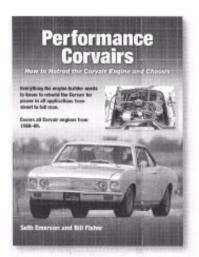

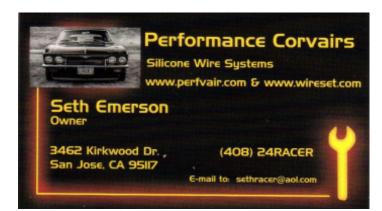
