Minutes of the Last Meeting

Dec 4, 2025

Josh got the regular meeting started around 6:55 PM following a short Board meeting. When the room was opened, Josh, Ray, Harry, Peter, Buck and I were quickly joined by Seth, Don, Carl, Lane, Christy, Chris, Scott Lyon and Paul. I hope I included everyone.

Treasury Report: Harry is still filling in as Club Treasurer. The bank balance, as reported in the last newsletter, was \$2298.22. Buck Jones will be taking over the Treasurer. A meeting with the bank is scheduled for Friday morning. Ray wrote up an official looking notice that the bank asked for, and they also wanted a copy of the Minutes showing where he was "elected".

Membership: Josh did not report any new members this month.

Old Business: Nothing specifically mentioned.

New Business: Josh said the next Convention will be in Gettysburg, and the following one in Tennessee. It's not too early to start making your plans.

Annual Holiday Dinner: This year's Holiday Dinner has been scheduled for December 6th at Lara's Fine Dining in Marina Bay, Richmond. Josh has 20 confirmed attendees. Should be a great time.

Phil's '66 Corsa: Don has installed the rear and front door cards after making some repairs. Clark worked on these a few months ago to repair spots

where the attachment tabs had pulled out. Apparently, these need some additional work. Another Work Day will be scheduled shortly in the new year. What's left is to finish the rear seat, install the new carpets and then install the front seats. Josh said we still had to check the brake lines and shoes. We will check the rubber mounts to be sure they are acceptable.

Events: The 2028 Convention is due to be held on the West Coast again. CORSA is looking at all options. Buck suggested starting the conversations with other clubs sooner rather than later. To ease the financial burden on attendees, maybe the clubs can pony up some dollars to help offset the high California room rates. Maybe being able to offer artificially low rates in some way. It's not too early to start thinking about this. Josh thought Napa would be a good local, and attract lots of attendees, if the costs were reasonable. He will talk with Bruce about possible venues as his wife is in Napa hospitality in some way. Josh said CORSA has an individual whose job it is to arrange events. This should take a lot of the burden off local clubs when it comes to Convention planning. Volunteers will still be needed but there will be less to do.

At the last Convention, CORSA offered a special 6-month membership to non-CORSA members who wanted to attend. Interestingly when this expired, none of the new members renewed. However, this was still beneficial as the final tally of 300 attendees showed. Seth asked if CORSA membership was required for all SFBA

members? Josh said that membership was encouraged but not required. The benefits of CORSA membership should be made known, like reduced Hagerty's Insurance cost and the Conventions which clubs could not put on without CORSA's help.

Tech: Carl reported that he found the issue with his engine. You may recall that when he was driving, he heard a loud mechanical noise and had the car towed home. The engine would turn over but there was a resistance at one point. Removing the heads reviled a small washer stuck in one of the cylinders. It looked like a carburetor washer, but he doesn't think he dropped this in the intake manifold, but he is not certain. In any case this did minor damage to the heads which should be repairable. He decided to go ahead with the complete rebuild as he wants to end up with a very reliable car. Carl has ordered lots of new parts from Clark's. Carl said because Australia has a special 10% Goods and Services Tax (GST) on imported items over \$1000 AUD, Clark's will break up the order in several packages.

Carl said he has taken his engine to a different mechanic. The other mechanic has had the engine for a few months and hadn't started to work on it. The new mechanic is a Porsche and VW specialist that's only 20 minutes away. He has already taken the engine apart (and split the case) and thought the head studs were corroded too much so they will be replaced. Some will need Helicoil inserts. He indicated he would



use standard size studs although oversize studs are available. Seth said that the studs were not meant to thread into Helicoils and would have to be rethreaded (or de-threaded?), but the mechanic should know all about this. The mechanic felt the old crankshaft should be reused as it didn't look like it had had a hard life. Carl has decided to install an Aluminum oil pan (from Clark's and not Otto Parts). Lane said he had trouble getting his Al oil pan to seal. He ended up ditching the gasket and just using lots of Silicon RTV sealant. Carl said he found a crack in the oil filter adapter housing and was looking for another.



He found one only two hours away. Another individual who had several Corvairs in a nearby town, had an extra. What luck! Peter said he has been working on the body of his Corvair. Now he is getting ready for paint. He is doing all of the body work himself. He will change the color to Gold Wood Yellow. Just like Josh's '64 Convertible.

Seth said he has been working on his Corvair. He has had the convertible top replaced, now the windows don't line up properly, but the Clark's top looks great. They are getting expensive (parts + installation). Now he has to tackle the paint. He plans to talk with Gabe about getting it painted. He wants a good job but short of perfection. Similar to what Gabe did for Bruce's son's Corvair. Josh said at the last Open House, Gabe was doing a Continental with a quick sanding and spray. Not a full-blown restoration. He didn't even take off all of the trim pieces, just masked over the hard to remove ones.

Last month Scott mentioned that the blower bearing on his Corvair was making a squealing noise. Josh lent him a tool for re-greasing the bearing and he said it worked very well. He pumped the unit until there was some resistance and then just a bit more as the bearing does not need very much grease. He said he found a stripped valve cover thread. Lane helped him install a Helicoil insert. He has purchased new throttle linkage from California Corvairs (same as Roger Parent linkage?) for his 110 engine. He will install it this weekend. Josh and Peter said the 4 carburetor linkage was much harder to install. There is very little clearance on the driver's side, rear carburetor. Lane said on his engine he had to grind down the spherical rod-end and replace a carburetor bolt with an Allen screw to get everything to fit. It's really tight! Carl said he installed Roger Parent linkage on his 110 and it installed easily so Scott should have little trouble.




