**7. TECH TIPS OR ARTICLE:**

**Windshield Installation Tips**

The July 2010 Tech Topics contained an article on stationary glass installation. Windshield removal on a


late model Corvair is usually done to access the lower windshield body panel and the upper rear area of both fenders for repair due to corrosion. In extreme cases, replacement of the affected sheer metal is required. The difficulty and complexity of this repair may result in the lower windshield mounting area not matching its original contour. This may cause only partial attachment and seal between the butyl tape and glass upon installation. Extreme pressure on the glass to achieve full contact should be avoided.

I would suggest one change in the original article, and an additional operation to assure a leakproof seal for the life of the vehicle. An additional benefit is that the windshield will never delaminate along its edges due to wicking action from exposure to the elements.

I would recommend that the butyl sealing tape be positioned so that there is a 3/8" gap between the edge of the tape and the wall of the body cavity. Placement of the glass will leave the sealing tape slightly recessed or just extending past the edge of the glass. Either or both are acceptable. Mask at least four inches of the windshield's exterior edge inward. Do not mask the edge of the glass. Also mask the upper portion of the body cavity wall to protect the reveal molding attachment clips. Coat the exposure sealing tape and the edge of the glass with 3M part #08681 primer or equivalent. It is assumed that the body cavity sealing surface has been primed in the previous procedure.

Purchase a tube of 3M window-weld urethane part #08609 or equivalent for use in the standard caulking gun. This product has a shelf life of days once opened. If used sparingly, one tub contains enough material to seal the front and rear glass on a late model coupe.

Cut the plastic nozzle on an extreme angle and apply the urethane from the base of the bottom of the body cavity to the upper edge of the glass in approximately



two-foot sections. Then paddle squeeze the material on a slight angle into the joint to fill all voids using the thin paint mixing stick or other suitable tool. The use of latex gloves during this procedure is highly recommended.

The masking tape can be removed immediately after application and the reveal moldings installed per the original article. The vehicle can be placed into service barring inclement weather. Leave a window slightly

open during its cure cycle of 12 hours to prevent an air pressure blowout of the urethane which can occur when closing a door.

Please be aware that this method of stationary glass attachment can never be used on (non-0Corvair) vehicle where the glass is considered a structural member. (11/10)

**Best of Show**


The winner of the Best of Show also won a Corvair Craft Glass Pensacola Beach Scene. James Frese, Seymour, TN, '65 Red Conv't
