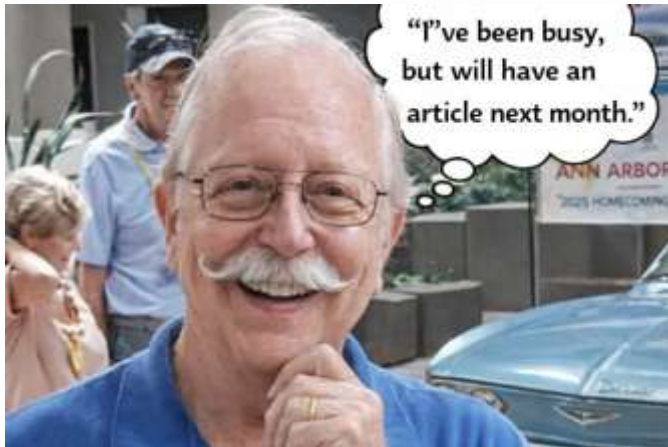

We found one of the camshaft lobes sitting in the oil pan. How does that happen? The guy had traveled way up north to get a replacement 140 engine and that was included in the deal, but it was not usable either. In the back of the garage was a stack of used cylinder heads, none of which were usable for anything other than scrap aluminum. I gave those bits to Gary K. With three days before his move I rounded up some help from

the World Famous (not really) DACC Garage Squad and hooked up the community trailer and grabbed some floor jacks and my engine crane. Gary Kamora and Ian Smith were roped into helping me save this car. We used the crane to pick up the back of the car and then rolled it up onto the trailer deck.



Once there we used the two floor jacks to position the shell in place for the trip back to the Caveman Garage in Farmington. After a successful extraction we re-installed the transaxle and bolted in a dummy engine block so the car could be rolled off the trailer and into my garage. Oh yes! There was no charge for the car. He just wanted to get it out of the rented garage before he had to leave it behind. I have had Corvairs given to me in the past, but this one looked pretty darn good for a freebie! The next task was to source an engine and get this beauty back up and running again. Enter my friend Steve Peterson from out in Martin, Michigan. He had a pair of '64 Monza coupes. One had a freshly rebuilt engine, but it got rear-ended and Hagerty totaled it. Steve saved the

salvage and put the new engine in his replacement '64 coupe. That car ran okay, but since he had this new engine, a swap was performed. He offered me the take-out engine, a 164 cube 95 HP (low compression runs on 87 Octane fuel) version if I came out to Martin to get it.



Free! Well, a free engine for a free Corvair sounds about right to me so off we went to the west side of the state to collect our new powerplant. After a work session here the car was running again. I cleaned it up and patched up the front floor and gave the floor a protective coat of Rustoleum. I sourced a set of new tires and put a nice set of 3-prong wire wheel covers on the car. It looked even better! But the back window was shot. I traded something for a new back window from another friend in the club and that was included in the deal when I sold it off. As happens now and again I did get the car back. We call that a boomerang Corvair. While out of my ownership a few things happened to the car. The new back window was installed, and the interior was pulled out and left for improvement. Okay. Remember this is the Freebie Convertible so I can't just order up new upholstery from Clark's. My solution was even more involved. How about I buy a "parts car" from New Jersey and then try to sell enough stuff off of that car to cover the cost of the purchase and the trip to retrieve it? I do have friends in the New Jersey club so they should be considered co-conspirators. In the end I was successful in getting the car here and stripping it enough to get a "freebie" beautiful white interior out of the deal. Only the carpet was not good enough to save BUT I sold the remnants of the black interior in my car for enough coin to order a new carpet from Rock Auto. Bonus! This concludes Part 1 of the story. Over the next few weeks, I will finish the install of the interior and fix a brake fluid leak. Once back on the road we will inspect the undercarriage better and do some reinforcement welding. Then if all goes according to plan this will be my summer driver. Can I get it done? Will I be able to restrain myself from selling it again? You'll just have to wait for the July Aircooler to read about it or better yet show up at the Homecoming in Ann Arbor and check it out for yourself.

## **The Origin of Concrete Median Barriers (National History)**

### **Early development: 1940s–1950s**

- The first experiments with concrete median barriers began in **California in the 1940s**, where engineers tried parabolic concrete shapes to stop trucks from crossing medians on mountain highways.
- New Jersey engineers then took the idea further, refining the shape through repeated field testing.

### **The modern “Jersey Barrier”: 1955–1959**

- New Jersey installed its **first concrete median barrier in 1955** on a dangerous section of US-22.

- The **standardized Jersey barrier profile**—the familiar sloped lower face and near-vertical upper face—was finalized and introduced in **1959**.
- The design proved highly effective at:
  - Preventing cross-median crashes
  - Redirecting vehicles instead of stopping them abruptly
  - Reducing rollovers

## Nationwide spread: 1960s–1970s

- After success on the Garden State Parkway and New Jersey Turnpike, the barrier spread across the U.S. during the **1960s and 1970s**, becoming the most common median barrier on freeways.

## When Michigan Adopted Concrete Median Barriers

Michigan’s adoption followed the national timeline:

### 1960s: Early installations

- As Michigan built out its Interstate system (I-75, I-94, I-96), MDOT began installing **Jersey-style concrete barriers** in **urban areas with narrow medians**, where steel guardrail was insufficient.
- This aligns with the national spread of Jersey barriers during the 1960s.

### 1970s: Widespread use

- By the **1970s**, concrete median barriers became **standard in Michigan** for:
  - Narrow medians
  - High-traffic urban freeways (Detroit, Flint, Grand Rapids)
  - Bridge approaches
- This period also coincided with the introduction of the **F-shape barrier** (1976), a refinement of the Jersey barrier that Michigan also adopted in some locations.

### 1980s–2000s: Expansion and modernization

- Michigan continued replacing older guardrail medians with concrete barriers on:
  - I-75 through Detroit and Oakland County
  - I-94 in Detroit and Macomb County
  - I-96 in Wayne and Oakland counties
- Taller 42-inch “tall wall” variants also appeared, especially in truck-heavy corridors.

### 2020s: Continued use and updated standards

- Michigan still uses concrete barriers extensively, and in **2023**, the state enacted a law requiring **concrete or crashworthy barriers** when freeways are closed for construction.

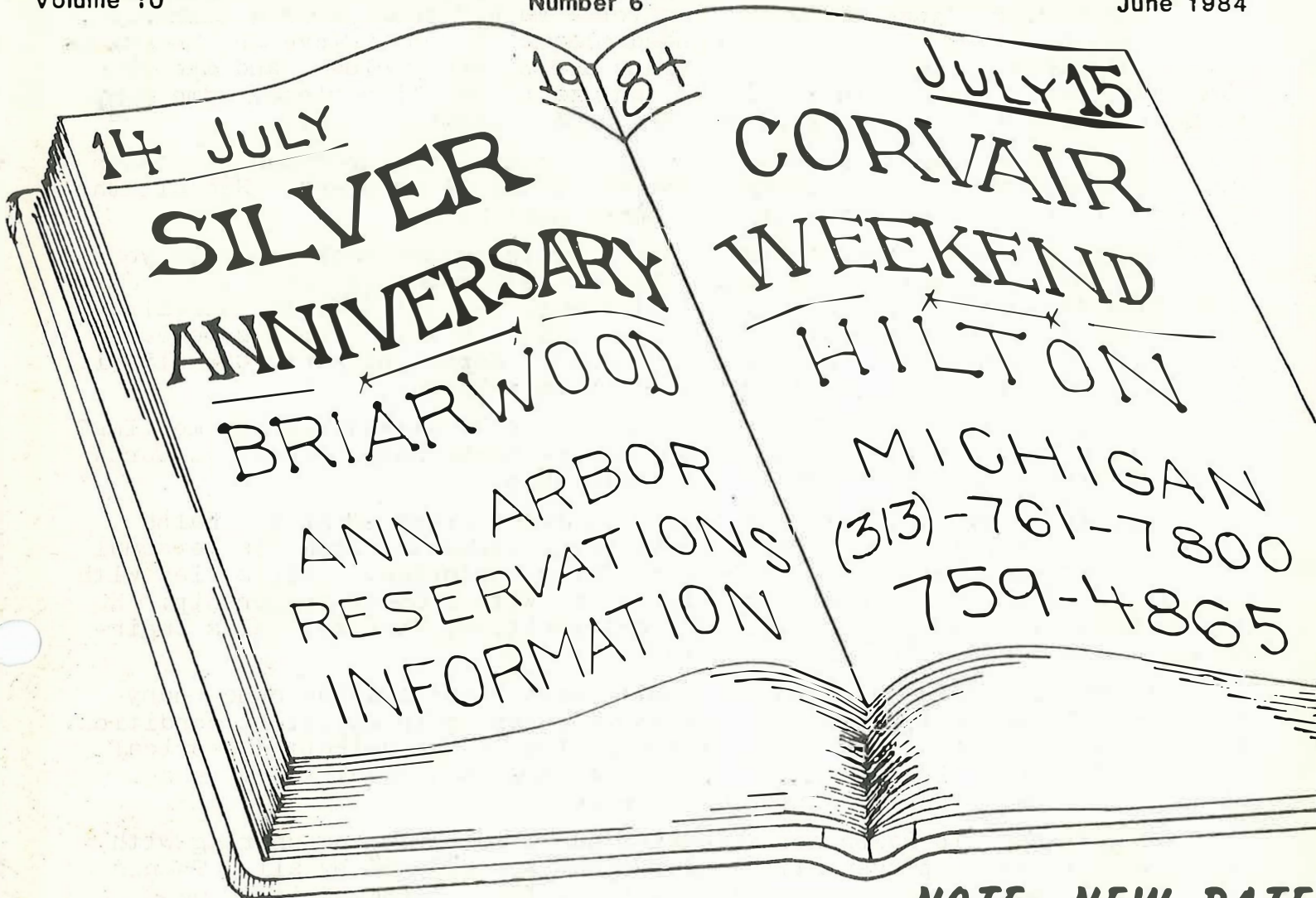

## KITCHEN KORNER

From the kitchen of Sharon Pepke comes this excellent formula for a delightful treat, perhaps to be enjoyed at a Corvair picnic.

### STRAWBERRY CREAM CHEESE PIE

8 oz package cream cheese  
 $\frac{1}{2}$  cup sugar  
 1 envelope Dream Whip  
 topping mix  
 1 9" pie shell (cool)  
 3 oz strawberry gelatin  
 1 cup boiling water  
 1 pint strawberries halved  
 and sweetened

Whip cheese until soft, beat in sugar. Prepare whipped topping mix; blend into cream cheese mixture. Line bottom and sides of pie shell with the mixture, mounding high at edges.

Desolve gelatin in boiling water. Drain syrup from strawberries; add cold water to syrup to make  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup. Add measured liquid. Chill until thickened; fold in strawberries. Spoon into cheese-lined crust without cover-

ing the narrow rim of cheese filling around the edge. Chill until gelatin is set - at least three hours.

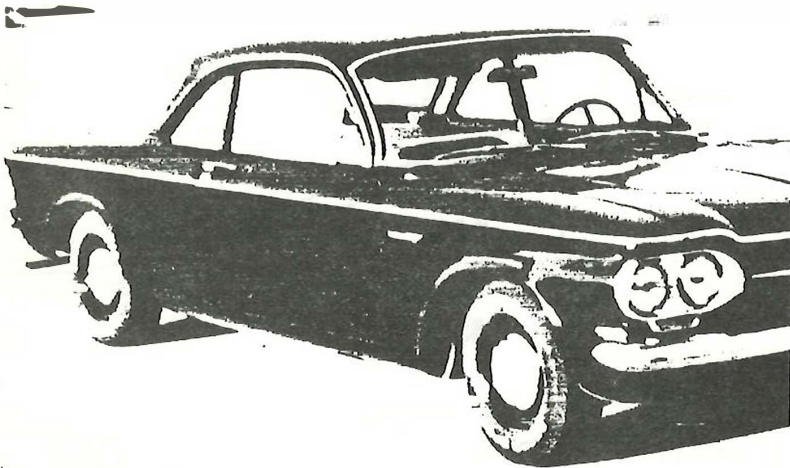
