

Ed Hendrick's 1958 Buick Roadmaster finds a new home

In December of 2012, I featured Ed Hendrick's 1958 Buick Roadmaster as our Car of the Month. Unfortunately, Ed passed away earlier this year after a long battle with cancer. Before he passed, Ed made arrangements to donate the Buick to the Sloan Longway Museum in Michigan. The following is the story of how the Buick made the trip to Flint, Michigan. The Fast Lane Car and TFLClassic had the unique privilege to cover the epic journey of a 1958 Buick Roadmaster 75 – in time, distance and the ethereal bonds of love. No kidding, the journey of this particular 1958 Buick Roadmaster 75 bounds past time fantastic into the realm of historical love.

Stay with me. Edwin (Ed) Hendricks of Englewood, CO painstakingly restored the 1958 Buick Roadmaster 75 from a rust-bucket to the pristine vehicle you see here. He didn't do it for the return on investment, he did it out of love for the car. After he passed away, his widow Barbara donated it to a special museum in Michigan. There was a caveat: rather than strap it to a car carrier, Ed's handsome '58 Buick was heading to Detroit in style.

We gathered in Englewood, CO (about 10 miles south of Denver, CO) and we're heading to the Sloan Longway Museum's Buick Automotive Gallery which is located at the Flint Cultural Center Campus, (303 Walnut Street, Flint, Michigan 48503). That's about 66 miles outside of Detroit. The Curator of Collections at the Sloan Longway Museum, Jeremy Dimick, made arrangements with Barbara to drive the 1958 Buick Roadmaster 75 under its own power following routes that existed back in 1958. Along the way, the convoy (Barbara followed with her friend in a 2002 Ford T-Brid) would cruise highway diners, motels and gas stations. And The Fast Lane Car (TFLCar) is going to chronicle the journey on-line and on video!

Our first leg: Englewood, Colorado to Columbus, Nebraska.

After departing precisely at 8:54ish, we used back roads to connect to Colorado Route 36. The 1958 Buick Roadmaster 75 drove great and we soon glided on to Interstate 30. I-30 would be our main route for the duration. Honestly? Nearly every roadside diner and motel are either gone, closed or vanished in the vortex of commuter indifference.

Over 500 miles past before we pulled into Columbus, NE. Closing out day one: more people have gawked and commented at the 58 Roadmaster than when I drove apurple Bentley. Honestly.

Second leg: Columbus, Nebraska to Dixon, Illinois

The 1958 Buick Roadmaster 75 flashed its chrome despite the morning mist in Columbus, Nebraska. Loading up my 2014 Buick Regal GS support/camera vehicle, we set out for another long drive on Interstate 30. Along the way, I conducted an interview inside the 1958 Buick Roadmaster 75, got some greasy 50's diner grub and watched the nostal-gic ruins of the past melt away.

Third leg: Dixon, Illinois to Flint, Michigan

One of the problems that made filming the 1958 Buick Roadmaster 75 cross country a challenge was the constant worry of mechanical difficulties. I need not have worried. On the final leg of the journey, the big Buick performed beautifully. Despite the wet weather, the 1958 Buick Roadmaster 75 was stable, dry and reliable.

We departed Dixon at around eight in the morning and pulled into Flint after eight at night. It rained most of the way, making filming problematic at best. Still, video was taken when Mother Nature took a breath and footage of the 1958 Buick Roadmaster 75 pulling into its new home. And what a home it is.

When we arrived at the Sloan Longway Museum's Buck section, my jaw nearly dropped to the floor. The restoration building contained some of the most iconic General Motors concept cars from the past.

Jeremy Dimick, the Curator of Collections at the Sloan Longway Museum, piloted the 1958 Buick Roadmaster 75 the entire 1,300+ miles. You could see him grow more attached to the big Buick as our journey progressed.



Capping off our final drive day, Barbara placed Ed's ashes in a lake he visited often.

1960....The Bobby Darin "Dream Car"



The 1960 DiDia 150 was a luxury, custom-designed iconic, handmade car also known as the "Dream Car" forever associated with its second owner, singer Bobby Darin. The car was designed by Andrew Di Dia, a clothing designer, who Bobby Darin had met whilst on tour in Detroit in 1957. Darin telling Di Dia at the time that he would purchase the car if he ever "hit it big". For seven years, from 1953 to 1960 the DiDia 150 was hand-built by four workers, at a cost of \$93,647 but sold to Darin in 1961 at a cost of over \$150,000 (1.5 million today). At the time the car was listed as most expensive custom-made car in the world by the Guinness Book of Records. The body was hand-formed by Ron Clark and constructed by Bob Kaiser from Clark Kaiser Customs.

Its metallic red paint was made with 30 coats of ground diamonds for sparkle. Built in Detroit, Michigan, only one example was ever built.

It has a rear-wheel drive, the body and chassis is handformed from 064 aluminum with a 125-inch wheelbase alloy tube frame. It has a glass cockpit in back, a squared steering wheel and thermostatically controlled air conditioning system.

The design included the first backseat-mounted radio speakers and hidden windshield wipers, that started themselves when it rained. Other features include retractable headlamps, rear indicators that swivel as the car turns, "floating" bumpers and a trunk that was hinged from the driver's side. Each of the four bucket seats have their own thermostatically controlled air conditioning, individual cigarette lighters and ashtrays, as well as a radio speaker.

Darin drove his wife, Sandra Dee, in the car to the 34th Academy Awards in 1961. When Bobby drove the car to the Academy Awards, Andrew Di Dia and Steve Blauner followed behind him in a limousine.

Di Dia toured the car around the country, when Darin wasn't using it for public appearances. After publicity and film use, Darin donated his 'Dream Car" to the St Louis Museum of Transportation in 1970 where it still remains.
