Our goal for hosting this event was to bring Fort Logan and its history to everyone's awareness. During the day, participants toured the two story museum and the first floor of the Commanding Officer's Quarters.

### Car of the Month

### 1966 Ford F250 Camper Special owned by Alan Carlson



This is the one and only truck owned by Jack Carlson, a WWII Submarine Vet and career Sailor. Before Jack passed he gave this truck to his grandson, Alan. Alan is now a Navy Aviator currently attached to the USS George H.W. Bush - CVN 77. This background is important to understand how the truck was restored.

The truck built in San Jose California and lived close by in Santa Clara. It was used to commute to work and carried a cab over camper for trips. This truck hauled that camper to Alaska and back in 1984. In the year of 2000 Alan drove the truck to Colorado. It was stored in his fathers, Richard, barn. After being there for 12 years, Richard and Alan decided to restore the truck to look as it was when new.

The restore was timed so the "interesting" stuff was completed when Alan was home on leave. He pulled the engine and transmission, trim. He was home when it was stripped down enough to be moved to the painter. Once back from the painter, the truck was put together to as much as necessary to have the engine installed and started. Alan was home on Christmas leave in 2013 and was able to put some time in on the project. He couldn't be more pleased with a rebuilt Motorcraft 2100 2 barrel carburetor under the tree. Who wouldn't be? On January first 2014, the '66 was moving again under its own power.

The truck was restored using the rebuilt original 352 CID engine, Cruise-O-Matic transmission, manual brakes and steering, oil bath air cleaner, trim, color and spilt rim wheels. Even the original California emission system was reused. Like many trucks of this era, it had a "Easy Rider" gun rack that was re-installed. Jack only allowed two stickers on his truck; the American Flag and a World War II Sub Vets decal. It took some searching to find a new Sub Vet sticker! The truck is now registered with 1966 Colorado Farm license plates.

It's fun to drive a classic that isn't the like the typical car you normally see restored. We have choices of classic cars to drive in this family; Model A Ford, two Thunderbirds, two 1957 Chevys, a Dodge Power Wagon, but there is nothing like driving around in Grandpa Jack's '66.

It also has the original engine & drive train. A year ago I took the body back to metal & amazingly found very little rust, save under the gas tank & driver's side floor board. Both

continue to run well and have served two of our grandsons (3 yet to go) as wonderful driver's training venues. Obviously the original wheels have been placed in storage in lieu of modern wheels & tires.
