#### The Jewett

Harry Jewett II is one of the few car owners to show a vehicle at the Eyes on Classic Design Show on the grounds of the Edsel and Eleanor Ford estate with his family name on it.

Jewett's grandfather, the first Harry Jewett, ran Paige Motors in Detroit. The company built the Jewett car from 1923 to 1926. "It was a cheaper verison of the Paige," Jewett said. "It had a big inline six-cylinder engine which made it popular out west where it was able to climb mountains."

"Jewetts are fairly rare now," said Jewett II. "I knew of 19 of them at one time, including one in rough condition in St. Clair shores." Fewer than 40,000 were built during the Jewett Motor Company's four years of production. The subsidiary of Paige-Detroit was folded in 1926 and the car became a model of the Paige-Detroit line without the Jewett name on it.

The first Harry Jewett made a fortune in mining around the turn of the century and decided to try the same in the then infant auto industry.

He acquired a car designed by Andrew Bachle which was being promoted by Fred O. Paige. Since Jewett didn't know much about autos, he installed Paige as president of his newly formed Paige-Detroit Motor Car Company in 1909. In 1910, having learned a bit about cars, he decided that the Paige automobile was "a piece of junk" and fired Paige, took over the company himself and hired a new engineering department to design a new car. The new car was a vast improvement over the older one, and Paige sales gradually picked up.

The Paige automobile gained a reputation for graceful styling and good performance. A smaller companion car was introduced in 1922, named after the president and founder, Harry Jewett.

In 1927, Jewett decided he had had enough of the auto industry and sold the business to the Graham Brothers who reorganized the company into the Graham-Paige Motor Company.

#### The Batmobile:

The Batmobile started out as the 1955 Lincoln Futura Concept Car. It was designed by William Schmidt who was the Manager of the Lincoln Styling Department in 1954. The cost to build the car was a staggering \$250,000.

In 1959, the car was leased to Metro Goldwyn Mayer for the movie *It Started With A Kiss*, starring Debbie Reynolds and Glenn Ford. Later George Barris purchased

the car from Ford during his time with the Custon Car Caravan. In 1965, Barris and his crew transformed the aging concept car into the Batmobile.

I just thought you should know.









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

# **This insane Cadillac concept remains a radioactive, laser-powered dream** — By Nick Jaynes, 2014

Back in 2009, Loren Kulesus – a very imaginative digital designer – came up with a very strange looking concept called the Cadillac World Thorium Fuel Concept. While its exterior dimensions were certainly notable, it's the stuff that powered it that really made waves – or lasers, rather.


The key energy source is a mildly radioactive metal, and one of the most dense materials known in nature, thorium. The thorium would be used to power a laser, which would then heat water, creating steam that turned a small turbine and propelled the car.

While some laughed at the concept (Top Gear even called it the Cadillac WTF Concept), a few others took Kulesus' idea quite seriously, specifically Laser Power Systems (LPS) from Connecticut.

LPS has created its own thorium engine, which, according to Industrytrap, weighs around 500 pounds and could power a car for 100 years on only eight grams of thorium, thereby supplanting more than 7,396 gallons of gasoline over a century. And that's just in one vehicle.


Just like the Cadillac World Thorium Fuel Concept, LPS engine isn't quite ready for a road trip. The company has reportedly been prepping prototypes since 2011. To our knowledge, however, no actual thorium-powered car has hit the road yet. We reached out to LPS for an update but CEO Dr. Charles Stevens didn't "have time to comment."

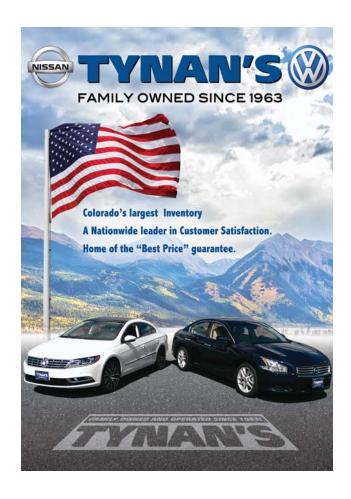




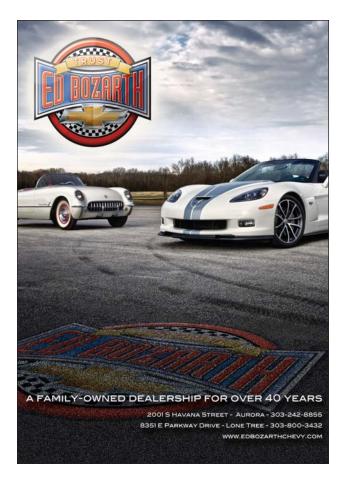

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
