Running from September 1st through the end of November, the exhibit is expected to have at least 15 air-cooled, rear-engine powered vehicles on display, from early and late sedans, convertibles, and coupes to Rampsides and vans. 
I did need a few things to make both FC's complete and ready for the show and I hope those I borrowed parts from remember what I borrowed as I didn't make a list.

TECH TIPS - REVISITED

These are reprints from the 1974 edition of the "San Diego Corvair Club Vair Tips". Thought folks might enjoy a Tech blast from the past.



HEATER HOSE GROUNDING BATTERY TIP NO. 2-1-1974

If your car's battery goes dead overnight, check to see if the heater hose is touching the starter. If it does it will drain the battery in a short time, since the hose has a steel coil inside. There is supposed to be an original equipment rubber sleeve around the heater hose to prevent this happening, but should it rot away it could cause a problem.

SANITARY OIL FILTER CHANGE TIP NO. 2-2-1974

Changing oil filters to prevent oil spillage when changing Corvair oil filters, cut an ordinary 1/2 gallon milk carton 3 inches from the bottom, slightly bang in two corners next to each other to clear the fan belt guide and engine mounts, and slip it under the oil filter. Loosen the filter retaining bolt and let the filter drop into the milk carton. Presto, not a drop of oil spilled on your immaculate engine. Lift the whole works out and discard.

OIL LEAK TIP NO. 7-3-1974

So the oil is leaking out of the engine bellhousing and you don't think it's right? You are right, but what is causing it? Simple, put a little bit of that oil on the tip of your finger and taste it. Yes, that's right, taste it! If it tastes like engine oil it is the forward seal of the crankshaft. The rear axel and transmission oil each have a particular taste. So the rear of the rear axel may be the problem. The rear axel and the engine have to be separated to repair either of the above problems.


