In January, the 1965 Corvair went through light snow to the post office to mail last-minute packages.




In January the Corvair Club went to the Dough-Re-Mi Bakery in Edgewood.


In April we met the Make-A-Wish coast-to-coast tour at the Owl Cafe.

In 1961 Chevrolet made a beautiful Corvair Station Wagon, the Lakewood. Is this one super-red or what?








