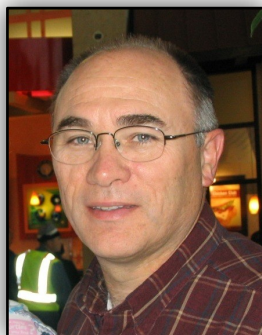


PRESIDENT'S CORNER

MEETING MINUTES - 1/17/2016
Golden Corral Restaurant, Colorado Springs, COSubmitted by

Meeting called to order at 9:25 am by Vice President Ed Halpin.

Twenty one members and one guest present. Introduced guest Tami, who is Joe's mom.

Old Business:

- No minutes from last meeting 'cuz it was a party.
- Treasurer report: \$2700+/- in the bank. Recently paid for the P.O. Box.
- CCCC dues has come due. Is \$50 + \$4 per in-state member, for a total of \$154 this year. Members present voted to stay with CCCC.

New Business:

- Discussed what the CCCC does in the legislature as it pertains to car clubs by raising visibility in favor of car club related issues. A political action committee (PAC) is being organized by the CCCC which will be strictly used to support the car hobby enthusiasts. Background on this topic was detailed in the January newsletter under CCCC Updates. PPCC support for the PAC was discussed. The PAC will be managed separately from the CCCC. Leo Boyle, the CCCC legislative lobbyist will only provide recommendations as to who/which campaigns would be supported. PPCC membership voted unanimously to contribute \$100 in support of the formation of the PAC.
- No Hagerty Insurance rep at this meeting. Will be set up for a future meeting.
- 2016 PPCC Dues are due. Dues are to be paid directly to our Treasurer, Mr. John Koll.
- In 2015, CORSA changed the Chapter Plan to reflect a flat \$35 per Chapter assessment fee, in lieu of continuing to track non-CORSA members in the local clubs. Current PPCC by-laws require membership in CORSA. Question was asked if PPCC should drop the requirement of membership in CORSA? Also, included in discussion is that CORSA could become insolvent at some time in the future. Ed Halpin is now one of the Western Region CORSA Directors, and encouraged PPCC members to be members of the CORSA organization. After discussion, John Koll moved to drop the requirement, Wayne seconded it. Club members present approved it unanimously.
- Ed Halpin has taken over membership responsibilities and is reaching out to past members to see why they've dropped and encourage them to rejoin.
- Meeting place discussed since the Woodmen Golden Corral's closing. Consensus was to keep the meeting place at Golden Corral off Powers and Palmer Park.
- Tri-State update from Chairman Chris Kimberly
 - Club members will have hats. Example was shown. This will enable attendees to identify PPCC members.
 - Patricia Fox will do Registration, will need up to five people's help. Mary Ellen and Wayne came forward to be on the help list.
 - T-shirt design shown, was designed by Kelina Halpin.
 - Hotel requires us not to drink our own alcohol on their patio. It is against state law and they could be shutdown if there is a violation.
 - Banquet will be at the hotel. Menu is still being decided. Target is to charge \$20-\$25 per person.
 - Show & Shine will be in the vicinity of a the host hotel, and in conjunction with a local car club. The Black Canyon Car Club is holding their yearly show the same weekend. They will be making their valve cover race track available to us. Their after show event will be at the local drive in, and we have been invited to attend. Attendee's of our banquet can caravan to their event after the banquet. Still determining if our group will have an entry fee to participate in the other car show or we can make a club donation to them as their car show is a charity event.
 - Build A Valve Cover Racer Workshop is being set up before the Tri-State. Date TBD.

- Fan Belt Toss pits are being built and competition is being arranged.
- Steve Goodman is doing dash plaques. Will also be the banquet MC.
- Sights to see in the Montrose area are being gathered. To date, a local Winery is willing to offer free tasting and tour. Also an organic cheese factory is in the area, as well as a vendor for homemade jams and a lavender farm. A comprehensive list will be made of sights in the area which will include museums.
- Volunteers may be needed for Show & Shine and fan belt toss.
- Centerpieces will be wine bottles with wine bottle T-shirt logo on them. Need someone who can drill holes in bottles so lights can be inserted. Bring wine bottles to next meeting.

CORVAIR DO'S AND DON'TS FOR 2016

The time for New Year's resolutions has passed and probably most of those well intended changes in lifestyle have already been ditched. So let's try resolutions that maybe easier to hold onto through the year.



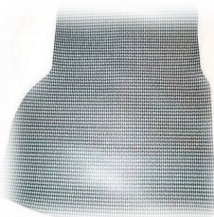
Don't slam your car doors--it is hard on the door alignment and the latches themselves. The springs and plastic parts break easier now that the car is 45-55 years old.

Don't slam the engine lid--the lid will close easily if you ease the lid down to the latch and then push gently. Adjust the latch if this doesn't work.



Don't use the steering wheel for a lever--when adjusting your seating position in the car use your hands against the seat or door frame. Most steering wheels are cracked at the spokes from pulling and pushing.

Don't put your knee in the seat; the seat springs aren't designed to have a sharp knee in the middle, it rips the center of the seat vinyl.



Don't leave rubber mats on the floor. Remove the rubber mats and let the carpet underneath dry out. The rubber traps moisture which will eventually rust the floor away. Treat the trunk mat the same way.

Don't use the sill plates for shoe sole scrapers--The sill plates are soft material and scratch and dent easily. Knock your shoes together outside the car before swinging your legs under the dash.



Do keep records of your maintenance and fuel--You won't have to guess when the oil was last changed and watching your fuel usage tells you when a tune-up may be needed. Records are particularly handy when you have more than one car (and who doesn't??)



Do watch tire pressures--One of the greatest detriments to the handling of our beloved CORVAIRS is errant tire pressures. It not only contributes to poor handling characteristics, but shortens the life the tires.



Do watch your wiper blades--Why did I pick wiper blades out of everything on the car?? EASY, when the rubber fails the sharp end of the wiper arm can score an arc in your windshield in just a couple of swipes. Windshields are too expensive to ruin over something so minor, the wiper is at your eye level all the time.



Do battery maintenance--Same question / same answer as above; dirty and corroded battery cables or dry battery cells contribute to many ill starting woes. Of course, the problem could be the starter itself but more often than not, the battery or connections is at fault.

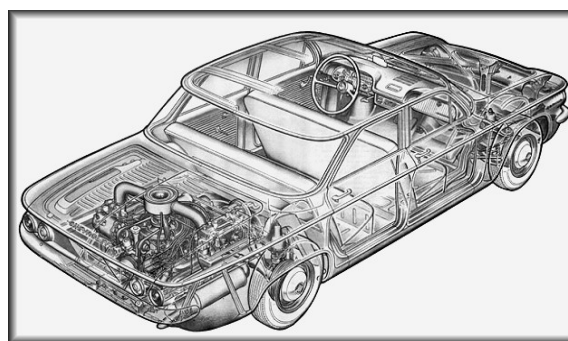
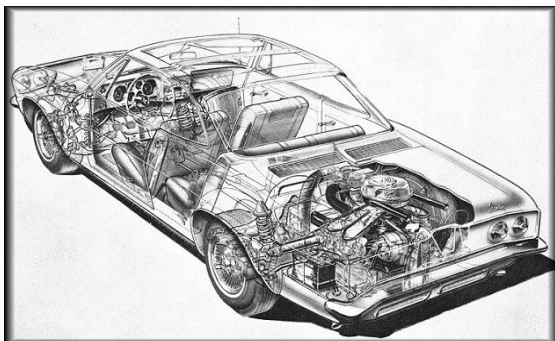
