

Geraldine Rockefeller Dodge's Cadillac "Dog Wagons"

John D. Rockefeller Sr., with his brother William A. Rockefeller Jr. and five partners formed the Standard Oil Company in 1870. Geraldine Rockefeller Dodge was William Rockefeller Jr. and Almira Geraldine Goodsell's daughter who was born in 1882. She married Marcellus Hartley Dodge Sr. the president of the Remington Arms Company in 1907.

Geraldine was an animal lover and philanthropist who along with her husband purchased an estate in Madison, New Jersey now known as Giralda Farms. She founded the Morris & Essex Kennel Club and formed and supported an internationally known dog show that was rated as one of the best of its kind.

Geraldine's husband had two "Dog Wagons" bulit that he described as being built on extended Cadillac "Sixty Special" chassis.' The two cars, six and eight door limousines fitted with coachwork by an unknown maker were used to transport her show dogs: English Cocker Spaniels and German Shepherds to events. Among the car's unique features is extensive chrome plating (even the suspension and gas lines), a machine-turned firewall, decorative engraving on the exterior brightwork and a sumptuous interior. The upholstery is Belgian leather; it had a silk top and diamond-etched windshield posts.

Route 66 Travel Postcard - Sullivan, Missouri

Saint Louis, Missouri is the first big city to pass through when traveling southwest along Route 66 after leaving the beginning of the Road in the City of Chicago. Seventy more miles down the Highway is Sullivan, Missouri, the location of today's postcard image.

In a travel scene repeated hundreds of times along the "Mother Road" before arriving at the end of it in Santa Monica, CA is the "The White Swan" Restaurant and right next door to it a Standard Oil Co. service station. At the gasoline pump island three grades of fuel are offered including Standard's "Red Crown" premium grade. Note a second gas pump globe at the top of the tower above the station.


