Minutes of Meeting, 3 July 2019

The meeting was called to order at 7:37 pm by President Dick Thompson at the ColoRODans clubhouse, 209 Kimbark St., in Longmont CO. Officers in attendance were Dick Thompson, president; Samantha Baker, 2nd VP; Dick Fritz, secretary, and Tom Kay, treasurer. 18 member clubs plus one individual member were signed in. Dick thanked the ColoRODans, specifically John and Lydia Ehrlich for hosting the meeting and providing food.

Legislative: Leo Boyle was not able to attend.

Minutes of the June meeting were approved as published.

The Treasurer's Report was approved.

Cruiz'n Havana: Dick Thompson summarized the June 8th event and suggestions from a follow-up meeting with event workers. The Aurora Police estimated that 3000 cars took part and there were minimal problems with traffic. Although the Havana Machine Shop has been a regular stop, that shop is now closed and other venues will be needed in the future. Communication with volunteer workers is always difficult and it is recommended that more detailed instructions should be provided to the volunteers. Also, to avoid weather that often turns bad in the afternoon, the hours should be set 10 am to 3 pm. The police recommend that the right hand lane on Havana be reserved for cruisers. The feature car for 2020 will be a 1974 Barracuda owned by John Schmidt. Photos of the 2019 Cruise are presented in the July issue of *Colorado Collector Car News*. Final accounting should show the

event was profitable, thanks to the support of sponsors and we are all urged to recognize the sponsors listed in the event program.

Air & Ground Show and Swap Meet, August 3. Dick Thompson reported on progress and plans for the Airport Show; the number of aircraft displays is growing steadily. Aircraft from both WWII and WWI will be there. For the swap meet 100 spaces will be marked off. Venders can erect canopies but these should not be set up Friday night (remember the winds last year?). Canopies must we weighted down with 40# at each leg. The Car Show area will accommodate 600 vehicles; Car Show entry is free. Spectator parking (\$5/car) will be at one lot (Oracle) and shuttle service to the show is provided. **Volunteers are needed** and we urge clubs to sign up as a group. We will issue a follow-up notice saying where and when volunteers are needed.

Mecum Auction (July 12-13): Discount spectator passes are available by contacting Mecum.com.

SEMA Show: CCCC will collect names of individuals who wish to receive complimentary passes through the procedure outlined last month (we can resend the information if you need it – phone Dick Fritz at 303-774-9710). Remember that we must have names by August 31.

Delinquent Clubs: Clubs that have renewed for 2019 will be removed from the CCCC mailing list and web site listing.

Longmont Cruise: The ColoRODans Rod Festival will be on July 27; the downtown cruise will be that evening.

Wicked Car Club Denver event: The Colorado Springs-based club will hold an event at Andy's Frozen Custard at 3505 Riverpoint Pkwy in Sheridan July 21st, 3-7 pm.

Cruis'n Panthers Buckley AFB event: September 14, 10am – 2 pm; must be preregistered to enter the Base.

Next Meeting: Wednesday, August 7, 7:30 pm. Location is yet to be determined.

The Show will feature static displays of vintage aircraft and vintage automobiles, as well as the CCCC Swap Meet. To make it all work, we need volunteers in various roles:

Friday afternoon, August 2: The layout marking of swap meet vender spaces, commercial venders and fencing will be carried out starting at noon Friday. Coordinator is Ted Rossi with help from the Colorado Classic Thunderbird Club (CCTC).
