Minutes of Meeting, 2 June 2021

The meeting was held at Gateway Classic Cars, 14150 Grasslands Drive, Englewood Colorado. Our host, Devin deSimone, described Gateway's consignment business which is coordinated with Gateway's other consignment facilities across the country to reach a world-wide audience of potential car buyers. Currently approximately 180 vehicles are on display in their warehouse. Gateway holds a Cars & Coffee on the last Saturday of each month and also can host occasional club meetings and provide a start location for club tours. Hagerty Insurance provided drinks and snacks for the meeting. Zach Hazelhurst described Hagerty's ongoing programs in support of club events and also can provide a venue for club events at their garage facility at 8101 Shaffer Parkway in Littleton. Both Gateway Classic Cars and Hagerty Insurance are supporting sponsors of the Airport Show.

The meeting was called to order at 7:31 pm. Since there was not a quorum present, this was an informational meeting. A new representative, John Alred of the Denver Roadsters Club was introduced and welcomed

Legislative: Leo Boyle reported that there are no bills in the Colorado Legislature specifically related to collector cars but a major transportation bill, SB21-260 will have consequences for all motorists in the state. SB21-260 will establish many new fees and enterprises and emphasizes infrastructure promoting the use of electric vehicles. Leo printed out a copy of the over 200-page bill (it weighs over a pound) and gave it to the secretary in case anyone wants to read the whole darned thing. The Denver Post on May 26th published two articles that summarized the fees and expenditures from the bill in a much more compact form.

Minutes: Official minutes of the April 2021 meeting were approved as published.

The treasurer's report was approved as presented.

Airport Show and Swap Meet: Dick Thompson reviewed the plans and preparations for the August 7th Car Show, Aircraft Show, and Swap Meet to be held at Rocky Mountain Metro Airport (Jeffco). In addition to Gateway Classics and Hagerty Insurance, American National Insurance will be a sponsor. There will be three car shows: MOPAR, Buick, and CSI with room for 500 cars. In addition to swap spaces, there will be booth spaces for commercial and non-profit groups. There will be an event program printed. Roger Zaner will bring the CCCC trailer for an event office and Anderson Farm will provide a shuttle trailer between spectator parking and the show. The CSI car show will charge \$10 per car, and spectators will be charged \$5 per adult. Coordination with law enforcement agencies has been made. There will be an air show by Rocky Mountain Renegades at noon and the Commemorative Air Force will have their restored B-29 bomber on display.

There will be "goodie bags" for entrants and we need promotional items to be included. Donations of advertising etc. items like pens and key chains are welcomed. We will have 100 swap spaces and we urge clubs to consider reserving one for club membership promotion and sale of excess car parts. If a club wants their cars in the car show to be grouped together, they should plan to come in together. Awards will be given out at 2 pm. Since the event will conclude by mid-afternoon it will not interfere with the Golden SuperCruise.
