### **Minutes of Meeting, 3 November 2021**

The meeting was called to order at 7:32 pm at the Forney Transportation Museum 4303 Brighton Blvd., Denver Colorado. Officers present were President Dick Thompson, 1<sup>st</sup> Vice president and acting Treasurer Tom Mansfield, 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President Samantha Baker, and Dick Fritz, secretary. 25 clubs and three individual members were in attendance. Guests were Anne Brinkman from the Colorado Mopar and RPM Mopar clubs and Rick Ruiz of the Cobra Club. Anne reported that Ivy Richard is out of the hospital but has a long recovery ahead of her.

**Legislative:** Leo Boyle noted that the Colorado Legislature will commence the 2022 session on January 14 and for the first couple of weeks will only be concerned with committee assignments. No bills will be introduced at that time.

**Rich Busby:** Carroll Reichen reported that Rich Busby, a long-time member of the American Truck Historical Society recently passed away. Rich was instrumental in getting recognition of large trucks as collectors items rather than always being considered commercial vehicles.

**Minutes:** The published minutes of the October 6th CCCC meeting were approved.

**Election of 2022 officers:** It was moved (Carroll Reichen) and seconded (Rick Nelson) that the slate of officers presented be elected. The motion was approved with objections only from Dick Thompson and Tom Mansfield.

**Club meetings and activities:** Clubs often are seeking speakers for their membership meetings. Dick Thompson and Ted Rossi have volunteered to present information about the Council and the Friends of Collector Cars PAC. The Golden Supercruise on the first Saturday of each month is an opportunity to meet other collectors but the Lafayette Cars & Coffee also on the first Saturday has had to be cancelled due to unreasonable behavior of some individuals.

**Sunshine Committee:** The Council from time to time hears about members who are ill or incapacitated, and to centralize a contact point for information, Anne Brinkman ([AnneB.Brinkman@gmail.com](mailto:AnneB.Brinkman@gmail.com)) has volunteered to be our contact person.

**Freedom to Drive:** This Colorado organization was organized in response to proposed regulations that seek to limit the use of personal vehicles, generally those with internal combustion engines. Regulations proposed include reduction of traffic lanes for cars, limiting parking spaces for private cars, and promotion of bus and bicycle alternatives. It was moved (Nelson) and seconded (Nielsen) that CCCC continue its affiliation with the Freedom to Drive organization. Motion passed unanimously.

**Forney Three-way events:** The Forney is coordinating with the Vehicle Vault in Parker and the RodZ & Bodz museum in the Colorado Mills shopping center on West Colfax in Denver with a Three-Museum Passport for \$33 which will allow attendance at all three, plus credit at their museum stores.

**P.O.Box cancelled:** CCCC has cancelled the P.O.Box at the central Denver location due to difficulty in getting to this location. Mail will now be forwarded to 880 W. 70<sup>th</sup> Pl, Denver CO 80221.

**2022 Budgets:** The budgets for CCCC are to be drawn up and presented at the December meeting.

**Next meeting:** The December 1st meeting will be held at O'Meara Ford, 400 W. 104<sup>th</sup> Ave., Denver. Start time is to be 7:30 pm and we have to be out by 9 pm.

**Adjournment:** The meeting adjourned at 8:36 pm.
