Minutes of Meeting, 1 February 2023 (Presidents' Night)

The meeting was held at the Rocky Mountain Metro Airport (RMMA) terminal building, Broomfield CO.

The meeting was called to order at 7:27 pm MST, by President Dick Thompson. 33 member clubs were signed in. Officers present were President Dick Thompson, 1st Vice President Tom Mansfield, 2nd Vice President Calvin Craig, Treasurer Samantha Baker, and Secretary Richard Fritz. Many club presidents were also signed in. Pizza, snacks, and soft drinks were provided by Paul Leuenberger of American National Insurance.

Our host, Paul Anslow, Airport Director at RMMA was introduced. He presented personally-engraved whiskey bottles to the winners at the 2022 CCCC Airport Show:

Leo Boyle reported that the Colorado Legislature began its 2023 Session in January and will meet for 4 months. He expects that 400 to 500 bills will be introduced and he will be on the lookout for ones that affect the car hobby such as one advocating year-round use of E-15 (ethanol 15%) fuel which would be bad for vintage vehicles.

Minutes: The minutes of the December 2022 CCCC meeting were approved as published.
