Nothing this month from the front seat, as the VP is unwell.

I can let you know that Rex and I enjoyed a few days in Cairns just after Christmas catching up with my folks - my parents, sister and her 2 boys and my Grandmother all live in Cairns. We had just enough time to catch up with everyone, (but not too long) and then we headed south to Brisbane to board the Carnival Encounter for our 10 day cruise in the South Pacific.

The first two days were at sea, getting to know the ship, and the food, and the pools - you know the drill. We then stopped at Espirito Santos in Vanuatu for our first shore day. We hadn't booked an excursion, but we got off the ship and wandered through the markets set up to take advantage of the sudden influx of almost 3000 people. The weather wasn't that good and the ship didn't dock where Rex thought it would, making it a half-mile walk to the town and small museum. We decided to forego that experience and the possibility of snorkeling (it was windy and also overcast, so not ideal for snorkeling anyway) in favour of sitting by the pool!

The next couple of days were also in Vanuatu - firstly Port Vila where we had booked a tour of a chocolate factory (with tastings), swim in a lagoon and then lunch at another swimming spot called Eden by the River. Our guide was great, and very knowledgeable about all sorts of things. He explained in great detail how the wildlife would NOT try to kill us, unlike



in Australia! He even stopped the minibus by the side of the road to pick up a spider and show it to us. Luckily (for him) he chose not to bring the spider on the bus. It was a great day with lovely weather.

Mystery Island was the next stop, and if we had our time again we would not have booked anything with Carnival, as there were multiple options on the beach for tours, fishing, snorkeling etc. None of them had any internet presence though so we didn't know about them beforehand. We did a cultural tour, learning about various uses for plants and animal products and the traditional way of life.

Then on to Noumea where we did a short bus tour around part of the island, then wandered through the town before returning to the ship. We were told that Noumea was expensive, and it was, but not too bad compared to prices that we were used to in Canberra - our 2 coffees cost us AUD\$15 whereas we would pay around \$12 here.

The last stop was Lifou where we did another tour - this one with a vanilla farm, scenic lookout, (we did not trek the 280 steps down the cliffs to the beach) Chieftan's hut and church. We were back on the ship for lunch again, then another 2 sea days before arriving back into Brisbane.



Of note on the sea days - we attended a trivia game and won a 'limited edition' medallion with a perfect scorecard. We stayed for the next thing in the theatre, which was the ship's version of the 'Today Show', and managed to score a free zipline on the ship each. It was over the main pool, and didn't take too long, but was a great something for nothing (and we would absolutely not have paid \$35 each!)



We hope y'all had a good break, and didn't get snowed in too much.
